Activities

Euro currency

The impact the introduction of the Euro has had on the Company is minimal. However system and product changes required to achieve Euro capability by 1 January 1999 were successfully implemented and work to change over to the Euro by 2002 remains on target. The incremental costs of the current Euro projects, including future costs, will be borne by the Parent company. Plans are also being developed to address the possible extended scope of the Euro, including the UK's potential entry.

K J Powell and P Spencer have served throughout the year. The directors did not have any interest in the shares of the Company. The interest in the shares of Royal & Sun Alliance Insurance Group plc for P Spencer is disclosed in the financial statements of that company.

We also report to you if, in our opinion, the directors' report is not consistent with the financial statements, if the company has not kept proper accounting records, if we have not received all the information and explanations we require for our audit, or if information specified by law regarding directors' remuneration and transactions is not disclosed.

We read the other information contained in the annual report and consider the implications for our report if we become aware of any apparent misstatements or material inconsistencies with the financial statements. The other information comprises only the directors' report.

Basis of audit opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the directors in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the company's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards, the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) issued by the Association of British Insurers in December 1998 and the provisions of section 255 of, and Schedule 9A to, the Companies Act 1985.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost accounting rules.

2 Investment return

Income from investments is included in the profit and loss account on an accruals basis. Realised and unrealised gains and losses are dealt with in the non-technical account. Realised gains and losses represent the net sale proceeds less the purchase price.

3 Taxation

Taxation in the non-technical account is based on profits and income for the year as determined in accordance with the relevant tax legislation, together with adjustments to provisions for prior years.

Deferred taxation is calculated on the liability method and consists of the estimated taxation, or relief from taxation, which is expected to arise in the foreseeable future from material timing differences using expected future rates of tax where applicable. Credit is taken for relief for trading losses only to the extent that the directors anticipate that profits will absorb such losses in the foreseeable future.

4 Investments

Investments are shown at market value. For listed securities the London Stock Exchange values are used.
