The Company carried on telecommunications training in the United Kingdom until 2001 when the trade was transferred to another company of the Cable & Wireless Communications Group (the Group) and the company became dormant.

The profit for the year after taxation amounted to \$5,927k (2013 – \$nil) and has been dealt with in the attached financial statements. The Directors do not recommend payment of a dividend (2013 - \$nil).

No change in the Company's activities is envisaged in the foreseeable future.

## Notes to the financial statements

#### 1. Accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items that are considered material in relation to the financial statements.

#### **Basis of preparation**

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and on the historical cost basis.

The Company is exempt by virtue of s400 of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirement to prepare group financial statements. These financial statements present information about the Company as an individual undertaking and not about its group.

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis, notwithstanding net liabilities of \$4,488,000. The directors have reviewed the financial position of the Company, including the arrangements with group undertakings, and believe that it remains appropriate to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis. The financial statements do not include any adjustments that would result from the going concern basis of preparation being inappropriate.

#### **Cash flow statement**

Under FRS1, the Company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement on the grounds that a parent undertaking includes the Company in its own published consolidated financial statements.

## **Related parties**

As a wholly owned subsidiary of Cable & Wireless Communications Plc, the Company has taken advantage of the exemption contained in FRS 8 and has therefore not disclosed transactions or balances with entities that form part of the group (or investees in the group qualifying as related parties). The consolidated financial statements of Cable & Wireless Communications Plc, within which this Company is included, can be obtained from the address given in note 9.

#### **Taxation**

The charge for taxation is based on the result for the year and takes into account taxation deferred because of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes.

Deferred tax is recognised, without discounting, in respect of all timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes which have arisen but not reversed by the balance sheet date, except as otherwise required by FRS 19.

#### 2. Information regarding directors, employees and auditor

Directors' emoluments are borne by other Group companies in the current and prior year. The Company had no employees during the year (2013: nil).

In the current year the auditor's remuneration was \$3,000 (2013: \$nil) for the audit of these financial statements, and was borne by another entity.
