<u>COUNCIL MEETINGS</u>: All meetings of the Council and the Annual General Meeting were held at the Northamptonshire College of Agriculture and attendance at Council meetings continued to be excellent.

<u>CHANGE OF SECRETARY</u>: Mr. P. Ryder-Davies tendered his resignation as Secretary at the Annual General Meeting to take effect on 31st December 1998. The new Secretary, Mrs. T.J. Booker, was appointed as from 1st January 1999.

RARE BREEDS SURVIVAL TRUST SUPPORT: The milk recording subsidy having completed its five year term, the Trust has agreed to give a further five year subsidy of £1,500 a year for a beef recording scheme. The Society is grateful to the Trust for its continuing support.

BEEF SUB-COMMITTEE: This small committee has held meetings to discuss ways in which the beef aspects of the breed could be promoted and enhanced. A major part of this work is the Society's intention to use the subsidy from the Rare Breeds Survival Trust to help members join the Signet beef recording scheme.

FIELD DAY: The 1998 Field Day was held at the Plumtree Herd by generous invitation of the Cockayne family. A large number of people enjoyed the event which included coffee, an excellent lunch and tea. Not only did they enjoy themselves but they were shown the large dairy herd and beef enterprise. The Cockaynes are now occupying a new farmstead with a new house on the edge of the village in which they have farmed since 1935. Their landlord is the Duchy of Lancaster and the new buildings enable them to use modern machinery. The Society is very grateful to the Cockayne family for the Field Day and for their continued support of the Red Poll breed.

ACCOUNTANTS' REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF

THE RED POLL CATTLE SOCIETY

We report on the accounts for the period ended 31 December 1998 set out on pages 6 to 11.

Respective responsibilities of council members and reporting accountants.

Company law requires the council members to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the society and of the surplus or deficit of the society for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the council members are required to:

Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;

Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;

Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The council members are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the society and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

As described above the society's council members are responsible for the preparation of the accounts, and they consider that the society is exempt from audit. It is our responsibility to carry out procedures designed to enable us to report our opinion.

Basis of opinion

Our work was conducted in accordance with the Statement of Standards for Reporting Accountants, and so our procedures consisted of comparing the accounts with the accounting records kept by the society, and making such limited enquiries of the officers of the society as we considered necessary for the purposes of this report. 31st December 1998

1(i) Accounting policies

The accounts of the Charity are prepared in accordance with The Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 195the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting by Charities, and with applicable accounting standards. The are drawn up on the historical accounting basis except that investments held as fixed assets are carried at markey value.

The society has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial reporting Standard No.1 from the requirement produce a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a small company.

(ii) Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation.

Depreciation of office furniture and equipment has been provided at 10% of written down value.

(iii) Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated in the balance sheet at mid-market value at the balance sheet date.

(iv) Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value after making due allowance for obsolete and slow-moviir stocks.

(v) Restricted Funds

Restricted funds are subject to specific conditions laid down by the donors as to how they may be used.
