Work of the Council

The Council is responsible for the promotion of the Red Poll breed in general and in particular to maintain the beef and milking qualities of the breed. The Council's activities are governed by the Articles of Association of the Society. Meetings of the Council and the Annual General Meeting were held at the Jersey Pavilion, Stoneleigh and attendance at Council meetings continued to be excellent.

Report of the Council for the year ended 31 December 2002 (Continued)

Promotional Activities

With the greatly appreciated support of the Rare Breeds Survival Trust under a five year scheme of £1,500 a year, the Society has been able to subsidise beef recording, directed towards identifying and improving the beef characteristics of the breed. This work is being done by subsidising individual membership of the Signet Beef Breeder Scheme (so far twelve members have claimed this subsidy, which is open to all breeders) and is overseen by a sub-committee of Council members, the Beef Sub-Committee. The scheme is now producing data of considerable interest and the Council would urge more breeders to take part in the scheme.

Publicity

The Society invested in new display boards for the increasing number of events at which the Society takes stands and is grateful for a generous donation towards the cost thereof. The Society continued to advertise throughout the year, which again resulted in a good response for information about the breed and stock availability.

Beef 2002

The Society took a stand at Beef 2002, which was held at Wooler Livestock Centre, Northumberland on 24th May. There was a great deal of interest in the stand, with its new display boards, and the cattle exhibited, provided by Mr. A.L. Barratt and Mr. & Mrs. K.M. Gray. Thanks must be given to the President, Mrs. Y. Prescott, Mr. R.S. Dawes, Lt. Col. J.R.G. Crisp, Mr. S.G. Prescott and Mrs. T.J. Booker and all the members who came to support the Society.

The Patron's Golden Jubilee

The Society was very pleased to participate in two events to celebrate Her Majesty The Queen's Golden Jubilee during 2002. During Her Majesty's Jubilee Tour to Bury St. Edmunds, the Society was represented as part of the Suffolk Trinity in the display of aspects of Suffolk life, the agricultural aspect of which was organised by Suffolk Agricultural Association and took place on Angel Hill. The Vice Chairman, Mrs. S. Mahon, represented the Society when Her Majesty visited the stand. In July the President, Mrs. Y. Prescott, and Mr. S.G. Prescott, together with Past Chairman, Mr. A.L. Fletcher and the Secretary, Mrs. T.J. Booker, were nominated to attend a garden party at Buckingham Palace given by Her Majesty and His Royal Highness The Duke of Edinburgh for organisations of which they are Patrons. Both were memorable occasions and the Society was delighted to be able to participate in the events.

Membership

23 new members joined the Society during the year; 4 died, 3 resigned and 8 were removed for non-payment of subscriptions. The total membership at the end of the year was 220 in comparison with 212 at the end of 2001.

Annual General Meeting

The Annual General Meeting was held on Saturday, 27th April 2002 and was well attended. Mr. Bruce Lawson gave a very interesting talk on the Premium Cattle Health Scheme run by the S.A.C.

Council members' responsibilities

Notes forming part of the unaudited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2002

1 Accounting policies

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention with the exception of investments which are stated at market value and in accordance with applicable accounting standards. The financial statements also comply with the Statements of Recommended Practice - 'Accounting by Charities'. The company has revised, as provided by Schedule 4 paragraph 3(3) of the Companies Act 1985, its format of accounts to include headings which are relevant to its activities thus enabling it to show a true and fair view.

Cashflow statement

The company has taken advantage of the exemption conferred by the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective June 2002) not to prepare a cashflow statement.

Income

Investment income and bank interest are included in the accounts when due. Other income is accounted for on a receipts basis.

Expenditure

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis.

Investments

Investments are stated at market value.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided to write off the cost, less estimated residual values, of all fixed assets over their useful economic lives. It is calculated at the following rate:

Office furniture and equipment

- 10% reducing balance

Specialist software and tele-visual equipment - 25% straight line

Fixed asset additions are capitalised where appropriate and depreciated in accordance with the above policy for items in excess of £100.

Stock

Stock is stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds comprise those funds which the trustees are free to use in accordance with the charitable objectives.

Life funds

Life subscriptions received are credited to the life fund. 10% of the life fund balance is credited to the general account each year.
