

ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1994

Members due to retire in 1995 but who are eligible for reelection are Messrs. H. Cheetham, A.C. Cockayne and Mr. A.M.G. Darby, Mrs. C. Mack, Mrs. S. Mahon and Mr. A.R. Prescott.

COUNCIL MEETINGS: All meetings of the Council and the Annual General Meeting were held at the Northamptonshire College of Agriculture and attendance at Council meetings continues to be excellent.

FIELD DAY: The 1994 Field Day was held in Suffolk with members and friends first visiting the Uggeshall Herd of Lt. Col. Giles Crisp in the morning and the Weylands Herd of Messrs. R.J. & C.J. Clark in the afternoon. The day was a great success and the Society is indebted to the owners of both herds for their support and hospitality.

REGIONAL ASSOCIATIONS: The Northern Counties Red Poll Breeders' Association continues to hold an excellent Field Day in conjunction with its A.G.M., this being held at the farm of Messrs. S.G. Prescott & Sons in Yorkshire in 1994.

<u>SEVENTH INTERNATIONAL RED POLL CONFERENCE</u>: This was held in Australia and contributions on the British Red Poll scene were made by Stephen Prescott and Mark Cheetham.

FEDW TROPHY: Mrs. Diana Flack awards this trophy annually to the exhibitor winning the most points at shows during the season. The winner for the 1993 show season was Messrs. S.G. Prescott & Sons.

MILKING COMPETITIONS: These two competitions are for the individual cow giving the biggest weight of butterfat and protein in a lactation and the same average figure for a herd. Miss H.R. Philipson-Stow's Underhills Herd won the Herd Competition with 419 kgs. and her cow, Underhills Tinsel, won the Individual Competition with 499 kgs.

SHOWS: Classes for Red Polls were offered at the Royal, Three Counties and Suffolk Shows. Champion Bull at the Royal Show was Messrs. S.G. Prescott & Sons' Woldsman Commandant, who was also Supreme Champion and Champion Cow was Messrs. Wright Cheetham & Sons' Longdendale Dairy Duchess 19th.

RARE BREEDS SURVIVAL TRUST SUPPORT: The Society continues to be very grateful to the Trust for its financial support for those who milk record. The Trust pays for 40% of the milk recording fees of those members in the scheme and the Society adds a further 25% to this. It is hoped that the information obtained from this essential exercise will be used to select bull mothers.

REGISTRATION OF BULLS: During the year the Council decided to make an alteration to the system for licensing and registering bulls in that the age at which this must be done has been widened so that bulls will now be registered when they are between one and two years of age.

RARE BULLS: The Council decided that to conserve stocks straws of semen of bulls whose individual stocks have fallen to low numbers would only be issued to applicants who would nominate the cows on which they were to be used and the cost of each straw would be increased, with a maximum of two straws being allowed for each cow.

<u>SEMEN SALES</u>: The value of the Society's stock of semen does not appear in the Society's Accounts but stocks of semen held by the Society on 31st December 1994 are shown below in comparison with the stocks held for the same date in 1993.

AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF

THE RED POLL CATTLE SOCIETY

I have audited the financial statements on pages 6 to 10 which have been prepared under the historical cost convention and the accounting policies set out on page 8.

Respective responsibilities of council members and auditors

Company law requires the council members to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Society and of the surplus or deficit for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the council members are required to:

Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently; Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Society will continue to operate.

The council members are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Society and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Society and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

It is my responsibility to form an independent opinion, based on my audit, on those statements and to report my opinion to you.

Basis of opinion

I conducted my audit in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the council members in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Society's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

I planned and performed my audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which I considered necessary in order to provide me with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error.

In forming my opinion I also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

Opinion

In my opinion the financial statements give a true and fair view of the state of the Society's affairs as at 31st December 1994, and of its surplus for the year then ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985.

1. Accounting policies
