#### ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1995

Your Council begs to present the Annual Report with Accounts for the year ended 31st December 1995.

Members elected to the Council were Messrs. H. Cheetham, A.C. Cockayne, A.M.G. Darby, A.L. Fletcher, Mrs. C. Mack and A.G. Prescott.

Members due to retire in 1996 but who are eligible for reelection are Mr. W.V. Caust, Lt. Col. J.R.G. Crisp, Messrs. A.J. Heath, E.J. Huxtable and P.G. Ullyott. During the year Mr. J.A. Cheetham was elected to the Council to fill the place of the late Mr. H. Cheetham.

**ACCOUNTS:** The high figure of expenditure for the distribution and storage of semen of £1,958 is due to the fact that late payments for 1994 storage were made to Genus in 1995 due to a delay with correct invoicing.

<u>COUNCIL MEETINGS</u>: All meetings of the Council and the Annual General Meeting were held at the Northamptonshire College of Agriculture and attendance at Council meetings continues to be excellent.

FIELD DAY: The 1995 Field Day was held at the Capps Herd near St. Albans by permission of Messrs. A.J. & A.A. Sherriff, who not only showed a large gathering of people an excellent herd of cattle but also provided most generous hospitality.

REGIONAL ASSOCIATION: The Northern Counties Red Poll Breeders' Association held its Field Day and A.G.M. at the farm of the Cockayne family in Nottinghamshire.

FEDW TROPHY: Mrs. Diana Flack again awarded this trophy to the exhibitor winning the most points at shows during the year. The winner for the 1994 show season was Messrs. S.G. Prescott & Sons.

MILKING COMPETITIONS: These two competitions are for the individual cow giving the biggest weight of butterfat and protein in a lactation and the same average figure for a herd. The Herd Competition was won by Miss H.R. Philipson-Stow's Underhills Herd with 379 kgs. and the Individual Competition was won by Messrs. Wright Cheetham & Sons' Barnsfield Myra 2nd with 549 kgs.

SHOWS: Classes for Red Polls were offered at the Royal, Three Counties and Suffolk Shows. Champion Bull at the Royal was Cheshire County Council's Longdendale George and Champion Female was Miss H.R. Philipson-Stow's Underhills Zinnia, who was also Supreme Champion.

RARE BREEDS SURVIVAL TRUST SUPPORT: The Society is indebted to the continued support of the Rare Breeds Survival Trust, which enables grants to be made to those who milk record to assist with recording fees. The Trust provides 40% of these fees and the Society adds a further 25% to this. A meeting was held with the Rare Breeds Survival Trust during the year to consider selecting young bulls, using the figures provided by the milk recording scheme. As a result, a young bull has been put onto an A.I. station by the Rare Breeds Survival Trust and semen will be available through the Trust and semen will also be collected for export. For the Society to consider placing a bull on an A.I. station itself would place a considerable financial burden on it. The very generous assistance offered by the R.B.S.T. means that semen from a most excellent young bull will be available to breeders.

During the year it was decided to raise the fees for registrations to £10 for heifers and £30 for bulls. Registration fees had not been increased for fifteen years.

**REGISTRATION OF BULLS:** The Society continues with its inspection scheme for the registration of bulls which must also have attained a specified weight at a certain age.

<u>SEMEN SALES</u>: The value of the Society's stock of semen does not appear in the Society's Accounts but stocks of semen held by the Society on 31st December 1995 are shown below in comparison with the stocks held for the same date in 1994.

Mrs. P.M. Stennett was the owner of the Braiseworth Herd and was a granddaughter of Henry Euren, the first Secretary of the Society.

#### AUDITOR'S REPORT TO THE MEMBERS OF

#### THE RED POLL CATTLE SOCIETY

I have audited the financial statements on pages 7 to 12 which have been prepared under the historical cost convention and the accounting policies set out on page 9.

#### Respective responsibilities of council members and auditors

Company law requires the council members to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Society and of the surplus or deficit for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the council members are required to:

Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently; Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Society will continue to operate.

The council members are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Society and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Society and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

It is my responsibility to form an independent opinion, based on my audit, on those statements and to report my opinion to you.

#### Basis of opinion

I conducted my audit in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the council members in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Society's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

I planned and performed my audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which I considered necessary in order to provide me with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming my opinion I also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

## Opinion

In my opinion the financial statements give a true and fair view of the state of the Society's affairs as at 31st December 1995, and of its deficit for the year then ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the provisions of the Companies Act 1985 applicable to small companies.

#### 31st December 1995

### 1. Accounting policies

The following accounting policies have been used in drawing up the company's financial statements.

# (i) Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and include the results of the society's operations which are described in the annual report and all of which are continuing.

The society has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No.1 from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a small company.

## (ii) Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation.

Depreciation of furniture and equipment has been provided at 10% of written down value.

# (iii) Stock

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value after making due allowance for obsolete and slow-moving stocks. Stocks of semen held at the A.I. Centre have neither been valued or brought into these accounts.

# 10. Liability of Members

The Red Poll Cattle Society is a company limited by guarantee and not having a share capital. In the event of the winding up or dissolution of the Society each members liability towards the debts and liabilities of the Society is restricted to a sum not exceeding £5.
