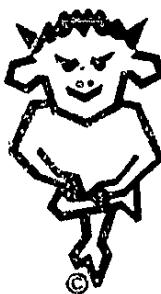
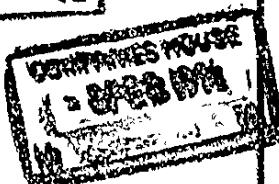
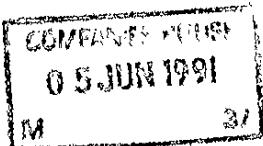

REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS TO THE SHAREHOLDERS OF LINCOLN CITY FOOTBALL CLUB COMPANY
LIMITED

The Directors submit their Report, together with the Audited Financial Statements for the year ended 30th June 1950.

RESULTS:

The Loss for the year, before extraordinary items, was £51,286.

The Directors do not recommend the payment of a Dividend for the year.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES, TRADING REVIEW AND FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS:

The Company is engaged in the running of a Professional Football Club.

There have been no events since the Balance Sheet date which materially affect the position of the Company other than the Transfer fees relating to players and the increase in the Authorised Share Capital from £100,000 to £100,000. A rights issue of new shares to existing shareholders has now been arranged.

FIXED ASSETS:

Principle changes in the year are detailed in notes 5 and 9 of the Statement of Accounts.

In the opinion of the Directors there is no material difference between market and book values of fixed assets.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES:

There have been no changes in accounting policies during the year.

The Financial Statements have been prepared under the historical cost accounting convention, using the following accounting policies.

(a) TURNOVER:

Turnover incorporates Gate Money, Football League Levy and Cup Pool, Advertising and Sponsorship.

(b) OTHER OPERATING INCOME:

Other Operating Income incorporates Net Transfer Fees, Fund Raising and Donations, and Social Club Receipts.

(c) DEPRECIATION:

Fixtures & Fittings - Social Club	- 10% p.a. reducing balance
Plant & Equipment	- 12 1/2% p.a. reducing balance
Bar Requisites	- Nil - retained at a nominal value of £615
Motor Vehicles	- 20% p.a. reducing balance
Ground Improvements	- straight line over the period of the lease
New Stand	- straight line over the period of the lease
New Stand Fixtures and Fittings	- 10% p.a. reducing balance

(d) STOCKS AND WORK IN PROGRESS:

8. ASSETS NOT INCLUDED IN BALANCE SHEET:

The assets of the Football Club do not include the value of the Registration and Transfer Fees receivable in respect of the Playing Staff as at 30th June 1990.

9. CAPITAL COMMITMENTS:

During the year the Company entered into an arrangement with Lincoln City Council re the development of the Stacey-West Stand and at 30th June 1990 £6,019 had been paid as shown in Schedule 5. Further expenditure on this project will be made during 1990/91 year.

The Company has not entered into any further major capital commitments after the Balance Sheet date, although discussions on further ground improvements are in progress.

The balance on Revaluation Reserve is in respect of the Leasold stand and no provision is made for any potential taxation liability that might arise if the asset was realised at the revalued figure.

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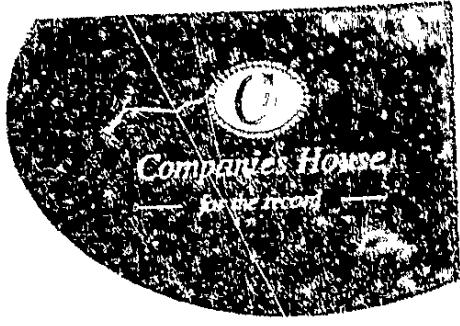
