As explained in the accounting policies and as shown in note number 9, tangible fixed assets are fully depreciated in the year of acquisition. This is not in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard number 15 or paragraph 18 schedule 4 of the Companies Act 1985, since the assets concerned are thereby depreciated over periods shorter than their useful economic lives.

Except for the foregoing, in our opinion the financial statements give a true and fair view of the state of the company's affairs as at 30 April 2000 and of its profit for the year then ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985."

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

TANGIBLE FIXED ASSETS

Fixed assets are stated at historical cost less depreciation.

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets other than freehold land and investment properties at rates calculated to write each asset down to its estimated residual value evenly over its expected useful life, as follows:-

Land and buildings

over one year

Plant and machinery

over one year

STOCK

Stock is valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost of finished goods and work in progress includes overheads appropriate to the stage of manufacture. Net realisable value is based upon estimated selling price less further costs expected to be incurred to completion and disposal. Provision is made for obsolete and slow-moving items.

DEFERRED TAXATION

Provision is made for taxation deferred or accelerated by the effect of timing differences, to the extent that it is probable that a liability will crystallise, at the rate expected to be ruling at that date.

PENSIONS CONTRIBUTIONS

The pension costs charged in the financial statements represent the contributions payable by the company during the year,

TURNOVER

Turnover represents the invoiced value, net of Value Added Tax, of goods sold and services provided to customers.
