It should be mentioned that Mr. Cheshire, for personal reasons, is relinquishing his post. The Directors desire to record their deep and grateful appreciation of Mr. Cheshire's splendid services.

During last season well-deserved benefits were taken by E. M. Nash and J. Ing.

Five of the Directors, viz., Messrs. A. J. L. White, E. Blount, C. Brown, H. Chegwidden, E. Thomas, retire by rotation, and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election.
