HIGGS AND HILL PLC INTERIM STATEMENT 1996

Whilst the Property division had another active period and the housing market started to recover, the Group's results for the period were again affected by the performance of the Construction division. Although turnover remained at much the same level as last year, losses before tax for the half year ended 30 June 1996 amounted to $\mathfrak{L}1.8$ million (1995: profits $\mathfrak{L}0.6$ million). A maintained interim dividend of 1p (1995: 1p) will be paid.

Conditions within the construction market remained harsh. New orders totalling \$130million have, however, been achieved so far this year including the manufacturing and headquarters buildings which comprise the first major phase of the Swan Valley distribution park, further retail and leisure projects and prestigious new office developments in the West End of London, at Manchester Airport and in central Birmingham. The work at Windsor Castle is progressing well and we have just been awarded the next phase of the restoration. The forward order book for the Construction division stood at \$150 million at the end of June. Whilst the division suffered from the difficulties within its Southern operations, the other regions and the plant company continued to perform well. For the second year running we have been voted Medium Sized Contractor of the Year by clients and professionals within the industry.

The restructuring of the Southern operations, to which I referred in my statement last year, is nearing completion and we are working through the problem contracts. Once these are behind us the division should be well placed to benefit as recovery in the market develops.

We are pleased to have concluded a settlement of the Guy's Hospital contract with the Guy's and St Thomas' Hospital Trust and to have agreed the basis for progressing the further work required by the client.

Within the Property division, the infrastructure work required to open the Swan Valley distribution and business park in Northampton has been completed and the first sale of 26 acres has been concluded with an owner-occupier. Terms have been agreed for the

sale of the next phase of a further 12 acres. It also sold an industrial development at Woodford and a warehousing scheme close to Stansted Airport. The division has built the first phase of a new development just outside Bristol to accommodate the Group's own activities in the South West part of the country. This phase has been sold subsequently to an institutional investor.

Activity within our continental property divisions remains quiet although we have now sold the remaining site in Spain. Carter Commercial Developments had a successful first half with the finalisation of a further 5 schemes for food retailers. THI PLC, in which the Group has a 25% interest, is close to completing its next two leisure schemes in Dagenham and Teesside.

The Housing division completed 200 units by 30 June (1995: 181 units) and is currently selling from a total of 16 sites. Signs of a recovery in the market increased but margins suffered from cost pressures. Average selling prices were much the same as last year but are expected to rise as more sales are made from higher value sites during the second half. We have started selling from the "flagship" island site at Port Solent. Following the excellent performance in the NHBC awards last year the division has achieved seven further awards this year for the quality of its site management.

There is growing evidence of the housing market recovering and a heartening level of activity within the property market. Progress this year will, however, continue to be overshadowed by the difficulties in the Southern operations within the Construction division. The Group as a whole will, therefore, remain in loss for the current year.

At 30 June net borrowings were £15.4 million (21% gearing) compared with £10.6 million at the end of 1995. The receipts of the settlement monies from Guy's Hospital and the first sale from the Northampton scheme have subsequently reversed this movement back to the level prevailing at the year end. Our priority is to focus investment within the Housing and Property divisions whilst preserving the financial strength of the Group.
