REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 1994

1. The Council presents its report and the audited accounts of the Association for the year ended 31st December 1994.

2. Objects

- a) To provide gratuitously or otherwise trained nurses to attend the sick and personal assistance for sick persons in condition of need, hardship or distress.
- b) To provide for the relief in sickness of persons in need, hardship or distress who are sick, convalescent, disabled, handicapped or infirm by providing directly or indirectly financial assistance to such persons or paying for food, appliances and other items for such persons or by providing directly or indirectly services or facilities which are calculated to alleviate the suffering or assist the recovery of such persons.
- c) To provide and encourage the education and training of nurses and of other helpers to look after and assist sick persons and for this purpose to make grants or loans to any other organisation which undertakes to provide such education and training.

3. Income

The excess of income over expenditure for the year, as shown by the income and expenditure account on page 6, is £246 (1993 £520).

4. Grants to Organisations Helping the Sick

Three main programmes of work are undertaken:

Aid-in-Sickness

A large number of small grants are made in order to provide comforts, appliances or services to individual residents of Merseyside who are sick or handicapped. These grants are administered on the Association's behalf by Liverpool Council of Social Service (L.C.S.S.) and Liverpool Personal Service Society (P.S.S.).

During the year £4,000 was received from United Way to be distributed as Aid In Sickness grants. By 31st December £3,307 had been given in grants.

4. (continued)

Grants to Organisations

At its meetings, the Council of the Association has considered appeals from organisations providing services or facilities to the sick or handicapped. The Association continues to give longer-term support to the development of innovative work and in 1994 made a grant of £2,500 in support of the P.S.S. Young Carers Project.

Single grants totalling £2,962 (1993 £2,750) were made to other organisations.

Nurses Education

Grants are made to individual nurses towards the cost of examination fees or study courses. Grants were made in 1994 totalling £3,690 (1993 £Nil).

Respective responsibilities of the Council and Auditors

As described on page 4 the Council is responsible for the preparation of financial statements. It is our responsibility to form an independent opinion, based on our audit, on those statements and to report our opinion to you.

Basis of opinion

We have conducted our audit in accordance with Auditing Standards. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the Directors in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the company's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Basis of Accounting

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost accounting rules and are in accordance with applicable accounting standards and Statement of Recommended Practice No. 2 (SORP 2): Accounting by Charities.

b) <u>Sale of Investments</u>

Profits less losses arising on the sale of investments are credited directly to the relevant fund.

c) <u>Investment Income</u>

Dividends are included in the Income and Expenditure account when they are paid at an amount which includes the tax credit recoverable from the Inland Revenue.

Bank interest is included in the Income and Expenditure account on a receivable basis.

- d) Investments are stated in the balance sheets at cost
- e) Monies received that are to be passed on are included in income to the extent that grants have been made against these monies. The balance of such monies is included as an asset and a corresponding liability to pay such grants in the future.
