PROPOSALS TO THE CREDITORS

It is proposed that the Company ultimately enters into a Company Voluntary Arrangement for the purpose of realising the Company's assets and agreeing creditors claims and distributing to the creditors the funds realised. If approved as a Voluntary Arrangement, it is proposed that the Administrators will cease to act.

As can be seen from the Estimated Outcome Statement attached, there are currently two options available for the proposed Company Voluntary Arrangement. Option 1 is for a sale of St James Park, Exeter at £2 million plus the value of the new serviced site at Matford. This is subject to planning permission being given for the development of a site on Matford. Such application was refused by Exeter City Council on 13 February 1995. Currently, due consideration is being given to the consequences of this decision. Option 2 is for the closure of Exeter City Football Club and for the sale of St James Park, Exeter at an estimated value of £700,000. This would probably be the only alternative if planning could not be obtained at Matford, Exeter. The Joint Administrators propose to convene a meeting of creditors to approve a Company Voluntary Arrangement following the resolution and clarification of the planning application.

The Joint Administrators believe that this is the most effective way of concluding this insolvency. The alternative to this proposal is for the Administrators to apply to the Court immediately for the discharge of the Administration Order and the making of a Winding-Up Order. The attached statement shows a comparison of the likely outcome of a Company Voluntary Arrangement under each of the options compared to a Compulsory Liquidation. Creditors should also be aware that in addition to the realisation and distribution fee, that a Liquidator would be entitled to charge in a Compulsory Liquidation, there would be an ad valorem fee charged by the Department of Trade and Industry on all funds deposited at the Bank of England, as is required in a Compulsory Liquidation.

MODIFICATION
