CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT

The Directors have pleasure in submitting their 76th Annual Report to the Members together with the Audited Accounts for the year ended 31st May 1986.

The Season under review we knew at the outset would be a testing time, after the riots at Birmingham and Luton, the Bradford fire disaster and the tragic happenings in Brussels at the European Cup Final, resulting in the European ban on all English Clubs.

Inevitably, attendances suffered and our own League gates fell to an average of 23,824, the lowest for some years. It has been a frustrating Season, with mixed results. The first team finished 7th in the League, exactly the same as in the previous Season. The Combination side played extremely well and missed winning the Championship by the narrowest of margins.

The South East Counties League team had a very successful Season, reaching the Semi-Final of the FA Youth Cup, the Final of the South East Counties League Cup and Southern Junior Floodist Cup. But sadily this was not to be their year. They lost on penalties to Manchester City in the Semi-Final of the FA Youth Cup and were narrowly defeated in the other competitions but managed to finish 4th in their League. The younger were are showing tremendous promise and I am sure they will fuifil the great hopes we have in them for the fitness.

Despite the drop in attendances, I am pleased to report a profit for the year of £44,086 after an adjustment for an excess of transfer fees received of £160,000. Taking into account the considerable sums spent on the upknep of the Stadhum, this is reasonably satisfactory, but we will continue to strive for improvement.

In March, our Managar. Don Howe and Chief Coach, John Cartwright, were released from their contracts and Steve Burtenshaw, our Chief Scout, did an excellent job in assuming responsibility for team matters for the remainder of the Season. We have been fortunate to secure the services of our ex-player and former Millwell PC manager, George Graham, who will be joined by Theo Poley as chief coach. George has served his apparentices ship in the lower divisions and has gained involunble experience which will serve him well in the task he has undertaken. We feel sure that we have made a wise choice and in welcoming them both, with them overy success.

in July we bearned with great suchness of the doubt of our President and great friend Sir Stanley Rous C.B.B.

Sir Stanley was a remarkable man who at the 130 of 91 still attended anatches regularly not only at Highbury but throughout the world. He was the game's leading asiministrator for almost half a century, a man who set standards for others to follow, wise and forever thoughtful of his follow man. He will be unlessed not only by those at the chib, but by footbell in general.

There has been much a tetry at the Stadhum during the close Season. As a result of the upgrading of our "Pire Certificate", we were advised to install a completely new fire inscreed and smake direction system. This we have now done at a cost of £140,000.00. We have also installed closed-sizealt television and are comforted by the fact that Pitghebery continues to be one of, if not the sufest Stadium in the country. This brings our expenditure on safety aspects to well in excess of £1 million in recent years. A new understalled heating system according to the hard at an approximate cost of £100,000.00 which is now fully operational. Unlike its predecessor, it is based on warm water pumped through some £3 anises of plants pipes buried because that metalicate is a well proven system already in use in many Stadia throughout the world and should ensure that metalicate are no longer local because of frozen surfaces.

in 1984, we instructed our architects and civil engineers to carry out an initial assessment of the feasibility of providing Executive Boxes on the South Terrace and as a result, a planning application was made during 1985 which was subsequently refused. The Club decided to appeal against this decision and we were naturally delighted when in May of this year, our appeal was allowed. We now have permission to install \$2 illness the Boxes above the South Terrace and although we have not set a deer for this development to community. We are in a position to proceed when the Board feet that the thing is right. Our Community Programme involving the extensive use of our JVC lastor Training Centre has proved to be an enermous success, with all of the available events such as aerobica, tedoor bowls, tends, weight training and of course, football, being well without.

It was pleasing to learn that the behavioural pattern of our supporters continues to improve and our thinks must go to our local Police for that help in carrying out what is often a very difficult tank. I would also like to place on record the sincere thanks of the Directors to every member of our Staff, both on and off the Bold, for their efforts throughout the Season
