

CHAIRMAN'S STATEMENT

It is very sad to report the death on 4th May of Mr Denis Hill-Wood our Chairman for the past 21 years. He joined the Board in 1949 and throughout his association with the Club, set and maintained the very highest standards. His integrity, inspiration and leadership will be sorely missed not only by everyone at the Club but by Football in general.

I am honoured to have been elected by the Board to succeed my father as Chairman and I will do everything I can to maintain the high standards of the Club.

We have now completed our first full Season of sponsorship with JVC (UK) Ltd and we are extremely pleased with our relationship. As was mentioned last year, part of the money received under the arrangement was used to convert our Indoor Hall into a fully equipped Indoor Training Centre. This is now completed. We have an artificial playing surface, changing rooms, gymnasium, physiotherapy room, shower facilities and viewing galley, and undoubtedly this is one of the finest Indoor Halls of its type in the country. This will bring considerable benefit not only to us but to the community as a whole and we are grateful to JVC for their co-operation in such a worthwhile venture.

In June, John Hollins was honoured in the Queen's Birthday list, and was awarded the MBE. He is a great ambassador for the game and on behalf of my colleagues, I extend to him our sincere congratulations.

Gate receipts at £1,593,616 were slightly down on the previous Season, due probably to first, the worsening economic climate and secondly to our inability, at least in the early part of the Season, to score goals. Lower attendances affect all other income and although at the balance sheet date, cash on deposit amounted to £1,504,000 our overall trading result was nonetheless disappointing, showing a loss of £40,766 which after adjustment to take account of the profit on disposal of property produced an overall profit of £56,372.

Much criticism was levelled at the Club during the year, some of it justified, but much of it ignorant and annoying. As was stated many times, the Board was not prepared to pay exorbitant fees for players, who, in the opinion of Terry Neill, were not up to our standard. I think that with hindsight, we have been proved right and a year of transition ended in us being 5th in the First Division and once more qualifying for the UEFA Cup.

During the year we had the gratification of seeing young players mature, particularly Stewart Robson, Chris Whyte and Paul Davis. During the close Season we were delighted to have been able to sign Tony Woodcock from FC Cologne, Vladimir Petrovic from Red Star Belgrade and Lee Chapman from Stoke City. The uncertainty that has arisen since the signing of Petrovic, due to the last minute intervention of the Yugoslav FA has obviously been very frustrating. However, this will hopefully be resolved in mid-September when the Yugoslav FA hold their summer meeting. These players are in the very highest class and we are looking forward to an exciting and successful year in 1983.

We are very proud that Arsenal were so well represented at the World Cup. Don Howe, Fred Street, Kenny Sansom, Graham Rix and Tony Woodcock for England; Pat Jennings for Northern Ireland; George Wood for Scotland and Vladimir Petrovic for Yugoslavia. Our congratulations to them all.

After some initial teething troubles the Executive Suite in the West Stand proved a great success. This is bome out by the very high rate of renewal and the speed at which we resold the tickets for the coming Season.

As usual a great deal of work has been done on maintaining the Stadium, much of the work, although expensive, is not noticeable but vital if we wish to keep Arsenal Stadium as one of the best in the country.

In closing I would like to place on record the Board's appreciation to the Staff, both on and off the field for their efforts throughout the Season.

We wish Terry Neill and his Staff and all of the Players the very best of luck for the coming Season which we hope will produce continued success.

Depreciation on all Fixed Assets other than Freehold Properties is calculated to write off cost during their expected normal lives by annual instalments at rates ranging from 10 per cent. to 25 per cent. No Depreciation has been provided in the year under review on Freehold Properties.

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.
