DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present their annual report on the affairs of the Company together with the audited financial statements and supporting notes for the year ended 31 December 2017.

The Company has taken advantage of the exemption granted under s414 of the Companies Act 2006 (as amended) and has not produced a Strategic Report. The Company has prepared financial statements in accordance with s396 of the Companies Act 2006.

Trading results and dividends

The profit before tax for the year was £788,000 (2016: nil) and the total comprehensive income for the year of £788,000 (2016: £3,348,000) has been taken to reserves.

No dividends were paid during the year (2016: nil).

Principal activities and future developments

The Company has carried on the activities of a holding company and the directors do not anticipate any changes in activities in the foreseeable future. The Company was a wholly-owned subsidiary throughout the year and accordingly consolidated group financial statements have not been prepared.

Financial risk management

Due to the fact the Company has not traded outside its activities as a holding company during the year and has no plans to commence trading within the foreseeable future, the Company does not consider it necessary to adopt a financial risks policy as such information is not considered material for the assessment of the assets, liabilities, financial position and profit or loss of the Company.

Going concern

The directors have a reasonable expectation that the Company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Thus they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the annual report and financial statements.

Further details regarding the adoption of the going concern basis can be found in the statement of accounting policies in the financial statements.

1. Accounting policies

Basis of preparation

Butterworth & Co. (Publishers) Limited (the 'Company') is a company incorporated in England and Wales under the Companies Act. The address of the registered office is given on page 1.

The Company meets the definition of a qualifying entity under Financial Reporting Standard (FRS) 100 issued by the Financial Reporting Council (FRC). Accordingly, for the year ended 31 December 2017 these financial statements were prepared in accordance with FRS 101 (Financial Reporting Standard 101) 'Reduced Disclosure Framework' issued by FRC, incorporating the amendments to company law made by The Companies, Partnerships and Groups (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2015 and in so doing has applied the requirements of International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) 1.6-33 and related appendices.

The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, except for financial instruments that are measured at fair values at the end of each reporting period, as explained in the accounting policies below.

The Company's financial statements are presented in sterling and all values are rounded to the nearest thousand pounds (£'000) except when otherwise indicated.

As permitted by FRS 101, the Company has taken advantage of the disclosure exemptions available under that standard in relation to business combinations, financial instruments, presentation of a cash-flow statement and standards not yet effective. Where relevant, equivalent disclosures have been given in the consolidated financial statements of RELX Group plc. The Annual Report and financial statements of RELX Group plc are available to the public and can be obtained as set out in note 11.

Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date, regardless of whether that price is directly observable or estimated using another valuation technique. In estimating the fair value of an asset or a liability, the Company takes into account the characteristics of the asset or liability if market participants would take those characteristics into account when pricing the asset or liability at the measurement date. Fair value for measurement purposes in these financial statements is determined on such a basis.

The principal accounting policies adopted are set out below.

Going concern

This entity is principally a holding company for which management has assessed the relevant factors surrounding going concern and concludes that there are no material events or uncertainties that may cast significant doubt about the ability of the Company to continue as a going concern. Accordingly, the directors continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the annual report and financial statements.

Taxation

Tax is charged or credited in the income statement except to the extent that the tax arises from a transaction or event which is recognised, in the same or a different period, outside the income statement (either in other comprehensive income, directly in equity, or through a business combination) in which case the tax appears in the same statement as the transaction that gave rise to it.

Current tax is the amount of corporate income taxes payable or recoverable based on the profit or loss for the period as adjusted for items that are not taxable or not deductible, and is calculated using tax rates and laws that were enacted or substantively enacted at the date of the statement of financial position. Management periodically evaluates positions taken in tax returns with respect to situations in which applicable tax regulation is subject to interpretation. Provisions are established where appropriate on the basis of amounts expected to be paid to the tax authorities.

1. Accounting policies (continued)

Investments

Investments in subsidiaries are stated at cost less any impairment in value. The Company assess investments for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value of the investment may not be recoverable. If such an indication of impairment exists the Company makes an estimation of the recoverable amount. Where the carrying value of the investment exceeds the recoverable amount, the investment is impaired and is written down to its recoverable amount.

Trade and other receivables

Financial instruments comprise trade and other receivables and payables.

Trade and other receivables are carried in the statement of financial position at invoiced value less allowance for estimated irrecoverable amounts. Irrecoverable amounts are estimated based on the ageing of trade receivables, experience and circumstance.

Trade and other payables

Trade payables and other payables are recognised at fair value.

Standards and amendments effective for the year

The interpretations and amendments to IFRS effective for 2017 have not had a significant impact on the accounting policies or reporting.

2. Information regarding directors and employees

The directors received no emoluments (2016: nil) in respect of their services to the Company. The Company has no employees (2016: nil).

3. Auditor's remuneration

The auditor's remuneration for the audit of the Company's annual financial statements was £3,672 (2016: £3,600) and was borne and not recharged by another group company for the current and preceding year.
