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REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2021

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2021. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objects of the charity

The objects of the charity are to win men and women for the service of God through the saving knowledge of God's holy word and the saving power of the Lord Jesus Christ.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Results for the year

Like 2020, 2021 was very much affected by the Coronavirus pandemic. The uncertainty over the easing of lockdown restrictions meant it was very difficult to plan events, and a decision was made quite early not to hold Spring Council in April and the Annual Conference in September. The majority of those involved in the Brotherhood and Sisterhood Movement are elderly, with some having health problems which put them into the UK Government's "vulnerable" category, and this was a major factor in the decision making.

At a local level, once restrictions were eased many of the affiliated societies did not immediately reopen, and some decided to close permanently. In some cases, this was influenced by local churches deciding not to reopen, but in many it was the age, health and mobility of their members. A small number of affiliated societies did, however, reopen and resumed holding regular meetings later in the year.

The National Executive Committee did not manage to meet face to face during 2021, although the majority of the National Officers were able to get together to discuss important matters, and were also in regular contact by e-mail. Communication was maintained with most of the NEC members by e-mail (or, in the case of one member, by telephone). When it became clear that restrictions were unlikely to return and it was becoming safer to meet together, an Annual General Meeting was planned for October. This was to have doubled as the Annual Company Meeting as well as the Annual Conference required by the Movement's Constitution; affiliated societies were invited to send representatives, and others who regularly attended Conference were also invited. Unfortunately, this meeting had to be cancelled at short notice (for reasons outlined below), but was rescheduled for February 2022 - and did take place then.

It was intended that the October 2021 meeting would formally appoint the National Officers and other members of the National Executive Committee, all having been appointed at the Annual Conference in September 2019 and then agreeing to continue for another year when the 2020 Conference was cancelled. In the event, this was dealt with at the meeting in February 2022 - but that is outwith the scope of this report. All members of the National Executive Committee are trustees of the charity, and the trustees continue to administer the funds of the Movement.

Two members of the NEC passed away towards the end of 2021, although neither was COVID related. First, in October, was Mr Bob Howarth, one of the two Secretaries responsible for communication with affiliated societies, and also a Past National President. It was his passing which caused the postponement of the meeting scheduled for October; the meeting and Bob's funeral would have occurred only a day or two apart. The second, at the start of December, was Mr John Carter, Chairman of the National Executive Committee and also a Past National President.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2021

With many of the few remaining affiliated societies closing down, and the average age of those involved at both local and national level continuing to increase, it became more apparent that the Movement is coming close to have served is purpose. Informal discussions took place about closing down the charity, and this was to be a major topic at the October meeting (it was subsequently discussed at the rescheduled meeting in February). To begin closure proceedings requires a formal resolution to be approved by Annual Conference, but at the end of 2021 no formal discussions had taken place. However, closure of the Brotherhood and Sisterhood Movement does not affect the operation of the individual affiliated societies, other than there will no longer be national events for them to attend.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

As in previous years, expenditure has significantly exceeded income, although the charity has enough reserves to last for several more years. However, with no events organised during 2021, expenditure was much lower than in years prior to 2020. Those who had made bookings for events in 2020 which were cancelled had their deposits or fees repaid. Payment of expenses continues to be in line with the Expenses Policy introduced in early 2017. Expenditure continues to be monitored and reduced wherever possible, with all payments (not just expense claims) being authorised by two "non-related" trustees in accordance with the Expenses Policy, and larger items of expenditure subject to approval by the NEC.

Reserves policy

At the year end the charity holds £228,648 (2020: £238,890) in reserves, of which £62,331 (2020: £62,331) are restricted reserves, and £2,624 (2020: £3,339) are invested in the equipment of the charity, leaving £163,693 (2020: £173,220) available as free reserves.

Reserves are essential to the running of the charity, and in ensuring it continues to meet the needs of its users. The reserves are used to provide working capital for the running of the charity, and ensure there is a financial safety net for any unexpected costs. The Reserves Policy of the trustees is that the financial resources of the Charity, proceeds of sales of hall and property, will be invested to secure the long-term future of the Charity.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a memorandum and articles of association incorporated 24 July 1919, as amended on 17 May 1950, 13 May 1967, 16 December 1988, and 3 September 1988. The charity is a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2021

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2019)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery - 15% on cost

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
