## CHAIRMANS REPORT

I would once again pay tribute to all our supporters who followed our fortunes through last season. It was indeed disappointing for everyone at the Club to finish on a low note after doing so well during most of the season, and whilst some may accuse me of making excuses, injuries at vital times were a reality and played a large part in our down turn.

It is also disappointing to report an operating loss of £216,826 almost entirely due to the loss on transfer activity (£100,461) and increases on our wage bill. The wage bill was affected by the fact that we were carrying a number of injured players throughout the year together with other players brought into cover.

I would thank our Supporters Club for their support during the year and for their sponsorship of this years Youth Team travel.

The commercial department are to be congratulated on their efforts for another good year with the Club shop playing an ever increasing part as a profit earner.

Our appreciation goes to the Secretary and Club staff for ensuring the smooth operation of the Club, also to the Club Steward, Sports Hall Manager and their staff who work tirelessly for the Club.

The Football in the Community Scheme goes from strength to strength as they expand their activities in the area and I know they are now regarded as one of the most successful schemes in the country.

On the football side I would thank the Team Manager and all his staff who work tirelessly in their efforts to bring success to the Club. They were probably more disappointed than any one at the end of the season but through their efforts many supporters came back and supported us, in fact season ticket sales for the current season are a Club record.

At the time of writing the report we find ourselves in the lower region of the division with a depleted playing pool. The season however is only half way through and with a fair share of luck and a lot of hard work we can still get back in contention.

On a brighter note, arising out of our injury problem I am pleased to report that we have been able to blood no fewer than four teenagers into the first team with some considerable success.

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention, modified to include the revaluation of freehold land and buildings.

#### Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on the reducing balance basis at the following rates:

Furniture, fittings and ground equipment 10% Motor vehicles 25%

No depreciation is provided on freehold property as in the cpinion of the directors the estimated residual value will always exceed book value.

#### Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value.
