DIRECTORS' REPORT - continued

YEAR 2000:

The Group has established a policy to investigate whether all relevant equipment will be Year 2000 compliant. A specific working party has been set up with the following objectives:

- 1. To review all of the Company's systems
- 2. To replace or upgrade these systems where necessary
- 3. To assess the impact on customers and suppliers

The findings of the working party acted upon accordingly.

The cost incurred and expensed in 1998/1999 in relation to Year 2000 are shown in the Newscorp Investments ("NCI") consolidated accounts.

Based on these efforts we are reasonably confident that all companies within the Group will be millennium compliant, although it is not possible to give any guarantees that no unforeseen problems will arise.

AUDITORS:

The Directors will place a resolution before the Annual General Meeting to reappoint Arthur Andersen as auditors for the ensuing year.

STATEMENT OF DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

Company law requires the Directors to prepare accounts for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Company and of its profit or loss for that period. In preparing those accounts, the Directors are required to:

- * select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- * make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;

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- * state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the accounts; and
- * prepare the accounts on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Company will continue in business.

The Directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose, with reasonable accuracy, at any time the financial position of the Company and enable them to ensure that the accounts comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTING POLICIES - 30 JUNE 1999

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING:

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

The Company's accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year.

Under section 228 of the Companies Act 1985 the Company is exempt from the requirement to prepare group accounts since it is a wholly owned subsidiary of Newscorp Investments which prepares consolidated accounts that are publicly available (Note 14).

CASH FLOW STATEMENT:

The Company is exempt from the requirement of Financial Reporting Standard 1 to include a cash flow statement as part of its financial statements because it is a wholly owned subsidiary undertaking of a body corporate. A consolidated cash flow statement is included in the accounts of The News Corporation Limited ("TNCL"), the ultimate parent company.

INVESTMENTS:

Fixed asset investments are shown at cost less provision for impairment. Income from investments is included in profit only if received, or declared and receivable. Franked investment income includes the appropriate taxation credit.

TAXATION:

Corporation tax is provided on taxable profits after group relief at current rates. It is the policy of the Group companies not to make payments to other group undertakings for group relief surrendered.

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS:

Other members of the Group provide the Company with all administrative and support services, for which no charge is made.

As a subsidiary undertaking of TNCL whose accounts are publicly available, the Company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard 8 Related Party Disclosures not to disclose transactions with other members of the group headed by TNCL.
