The Directors submit their report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31st December 2006

## Principal activities

The company did not carry out any trading activities during the period. The Directors do not envisage any change to the nature of the business for the foreseeable future.

The Company made a loss on ordinary activities after taxation of £235,000 (2005 - loss of £9,000) The Directors are of the opinion that the current level of activity will continue in the foreseeable future

The loss for the financial year of £235,000 will be transferred from reserves (2005 - loss for the financial year of £9,000 transferred from reserves)

## Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 31st December 2006

#### Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies adopted in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below

### (a) Basis of accounting

These financial statements have been prepared using the historical cost convention, and have been drawn up in accordance with UK generally accepted accounting principles and with UK accounting presentation

### (b) Foreign currency transactions

Foreign currency transactions are booked in local currency at the exchange rate ruling on the date of the transaction, or at the forward rate if hedged by a forward exchange contract. Foreign currency assets and liabilities are translated into local currency at rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date, or at the forward rate. Exchange differences are included in trading profit. The retranslation of the opening reserves and results for the period of overseas branches that are denominated in a foreign currency are taken to the statement of total recognised gains and losses.

### (c) Taxation

The Company accounts for taxation which is deferred or accelerated by reason of timing differences which have originated but not reversed by the balance sheet date. Deferred tax assets are only recognised to the extent that they are considered recoverable against future taxable profits.

Deferred tax is measured at the average tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which the timing differences are expected to reverse. Deferred tax liabilities and assets are not discounted
