DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present their report and the group accounts for the year ended 31 December 1997.

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The group profit for the year, after taxation and minority interests amounted to £4,546,000. The directors recommend a "B" ordinary dividend of £530,912 and a "C" ordinary dividend of £13,088. After preference dividends of £18,235, this leaves a retained profit of £3,984,000.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND REVIEW OF THE BUSINESS

The group's principal activities during the year continued to be publishing and there were no significant changes during the year. The group continues to trade profitably and the directors anticipate sustained growth for the foreseeable future.

In 1997 the group acquired four businesses: Bullet Communications Limited, Colloquium International Limited, both healthcare services companies, Fracture and Fatigue of Engineering Materials and Structures Limited, a publisher of the journal of the same name and Info Nordic I Hjo AB, a publisher based in Sweden. In addition, it acquired an additional 5% equity holding in Healthgate Data Corporation, a US provider of healthcare information on the Internet. In February 1997 the group sold its French language publishing and book-selling interest in Arnette Blackwell SA. The directors are confident that these strategic changes in the structure of the group will strengthen its business and profitability for the future.

FIXED ASSETS

The changes in fixed assets during the year are summarised in notes 12 and 13.

DISABLED EMPLOYEES

The group gives full consideration to applications for employment from disabled persons where the requirements of the job can be adequately fulfilled by a handicapped or disabled person.

Where existing employees become disabled, it is the group's policy wherever practicable to provide continuing employment under normal terms and conditions and to provide training and career development and promotion wherever appropriate.

EMPLOYEE INVOLVEMENT

The group has arrangements for providing information to employees and regular meetings are held between local management and employees to allow a free flow of information and ideas.

CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTIONS

During the year, the company made charitable contributions totalling £87,983.

DIRECTORS' AND OFFICERS' LIABILITY INSURANCE

During the year the company purchased and maintained liability insurance for its directors and officers as permitted by Section 310(3) of the Companies Act 1985.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention modified to include the revaluation of certain land and buildings and investments.

The accounts are prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

Basis of consolidation

The group accounts consolidate the accounts of Blackwell Science Limited and all its subsidiary undertakings drawn up to 31 December each year. No profit and loss account is presented for Blackwell Science Limited as provided by section 230 of the Companies Act 1985.

Undertakings, other than subsidiary undertakings, in which the group has an investment representing not less than 20% of the voting rights and over which it exerts significant influence, are treated as associated undertakings. The group accounts include the appropriate share of these undertakings' results and reserves based on audited accounts to 31 December 1997, except for Blackwell Delaware Inc., whose results are included for their accounting year to 31 August 1997.

Goodwill

Depending on the circumstances of each acquisition, purchased goodwill is either set off directly against reserves or amortised through the profit and loss account over the directors' estimate of its useful life.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on all tangible fixed assets except freehold land, at rates calculated to write off the cost or valuation, less estimated residual value, of each asset evenly over its expected useful life, as follows:

Freehold buildings - 2 - 7% per annum

Fixtures and fittings and equipment - 3 - 6 years

Motor vehicles - 4 - 5 years

Stocks

Stocks and work in progress are stated at the lower of cost incurred and net realisable value on bases and methods applied consistently.

Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided using the liability method on all timing differences to the extent that they are expected to reverse in the future without being replaced, calculated at the rate at which it is anticipated the timing differences will reverse. Advance corporation tax which is expected to be recoverable in the future is deducted from the deferred taxation balance. Tax losses are surrendered in the most beneficial manner and payment equal to the amount of tax saved is made for the amount of group relief received.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Foreign currencies

Company

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling at the date of the transaction, or at the contracted rate if the transaction is covered by a foreign exchange contract. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are retranslated at the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. All differences are taken to the profit and loss account.

Group

The accounts of overseas entities denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the rate of exchange ruling at the group balance sheet date. The exchange difference arising on the retranslation of opening net assets is taken directly to reserves. All other translation differences are taken to the profit and loss account.

Leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to income on a straight line basis over the term of the lease.

Pensions

The company participates, with other employers, in a defined benefit pension scheme.

Contributions to this fund are charged to the profit and loss account so as to spread the cost of pensions over the employees' working lives within the group. Variations in pension cost, which are identified as a result of actuarial valuations, are amortised over the average expected remaining working lives of employees in proportion to their expected payroll costs. Differences between the amounts funded and the amounts charged to the profit and loss account are treated as either provisions or repayments in the balance sheet.

Summary of class rights

The "A" shares have no dividend rights under the existing Articles of Association of the company. On a winding up their rights are restricted to a repayment of the capital paid up at par.

The "A" shares have full voting rights. All other classes of shares carry only restricted voting rights.

The "B" shares and "C" shares both carry rights to receive dividends after the preference dividends have been paid. They also carry the rights to repayment of capital and to share in any surplus assets arising.

Although the "B" shares and "C" shares rank equally as regards the entitlement to receive dividends or to share in a surplus on winding up, the amounts receivable by the holders of the "C" shares are restricted.

The non-redeemable cumulative preference shares are entitled to a fixed cumulative preferential dividend at the rate of 5.6% per annum. On a winding up the holders of these shares are entitled to a repayment of £1.05 per share, before any repayment of capital on the "A", "B" and "C" shares.

Executive share option scheme

The company operates an executive share option scheme for directors and other senior employees of the company, under which the company may grant options to acquire "C" (restricted voting) shares only. Options under this scheme are generally exercisable between 3 and 7 years after the date of grant.

During the year 1,400 share options were issued. The total number of "C" shares available for issue at the year end is 285,900.

25. CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

The company has guaranteed the borrowings and rental agreements of subsidiary undertakings to the extent of £1,226,000 and £435,805 respectively (1996 - £1,570,290 and £435,805).

The company has guaranteed the due and proper performance of its subsidiary undertaking, Compact Information Limited's obligations to its main customers, and payment of amounts due by its associated company, Marston Book Services Limited, to one of its customers up to a maximum of £850,000 (1996 - £nil).

26. PENSION COMMITMENTS

The company contributes, with other employers, to a pension scheme providing benefits based on employees' final pensionable pay. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the company, being invested with Blackwell's Superannuation Fund. Contributions to the scheme are determined by qualified actuaries on the basis of triennial valuations using the "projected unit method".

The latest full actuarial valuation of the scheme was carried out as at 31 March 1996 by Godwins Limited, the scheme's consulting actuaries. The assumptions having the most significant effect on the results of the valuation were as follows:

Rate of investment return

9% per annum

Salary increases

6.5% per annum

Future pension increases

4.3% per annum, or in line with the Retail Prices Index if less

This valuation showed the actuarial value of the scheme's assets to be £47,175,000. Rates of contributions, together with existing assets of the scheme and income from future investments, are expected to be sufficient to meet the costs of present benefits and to provide for future pension increases on the same basis as those granted in previous years.

27. FORWARD TRANSACTIONS IN FOREIGN CURRENCY

At 31 December 1997, the company had outstanding forward exchange contracts maturing within three years to sell certain foreign currencies for operational requirements. At contracted rates of exchange, these contracts had an aggregate Sterling value of £4,599,276 (1996 £5,050,131).

28. TRANSACTIONS WITH RELATED PARTIES

The company purchased warehousing and distribution services from Marston Book Services Limited of £2,912,000 (1996, £2,924,000). Acting as distributor, Marston Book Services Limited sold books on behalf of the company of £8,731,000 (1996, £10,628,000). The net balance owing to the company at 31 December 1997 was £2,747,000 (1996, £3,135,000).

The company sold journals in the normal course of trading on an arm's length basis of £3,953,000 (1996 £3,765,000) to the Blackwell Limited group. Blackwell Limited is a company registered in England and Wales and related through common ownership.

The company also entered into other transactions with group companies in the normal course of trading. The directors do not consider such transactions to have been material.
