#### DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 1994

The directors submit their Report and audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 1994.

#### **REVIEW OF THE BUSINESS AND PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES**

The Company holds various freehold properties and leasehold interests which it has managed throughout the year.

The Company's income arises from rental on property, discounts receivable on sales into the estate, amusement machine income and profits from the sale of property.

The directors intend to continue the programme of disposal of low yielding properties.

#### **RESULTS AND TRANSFER FROM RESERVES**

The Company's results are set out in the profit and loss account on page 5. The Directors do not recommend the payment of a dividend (1993: Nil). The profit for the year of £306,000 (1993 - £70,000) has been transferred to reserves.

#### STATEMENT OF DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

# NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS - 31 DECEMBER 1994

#### 1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### (1) Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, modified to include the revaluation of land and buildings, and in accordance with applicable accounting standards. Compliance with SSAP 19 "Accounting for Investment Properties" requires departure from the requirements of Companies Act 1985 relating to depreciation and amortisation and an explanation of the departure is given in note 7 below.

#### (2) Taxation

The charge for taxation is based on the profit for the year and takes into account taxation deferred because of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes. Deferred taxation, on differences between the treatment of certain items for accounting and taxation purposes, is accounted for to the extent that a liability for an asset is expected to crystallise within the foreseeable future.

#### (3) Depreciation

Tangible assets are depreciated in equal instalments at rates calculated to write off their cost over the term of their estimated useful lives. Details of depreciation rates are given in note 7.

#### (4) Stocks

Valuation of stocks is at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

#### 2 TURNOVER

Turnover derives from rental income receivable from tenants on the estate.

In accordance with SSAP 19, investment properties are revalued annually and the individual surpluses or deficits are transferred to revaluation reserve with any net deficit on the revaluation reserve transferred to the profit and loss account. No provision is made for depreciation of freehold properties or for amortisation of leasehold properties held on leases having more than 20 years unexpired. This departure from the requirements of the Companies Act 1985, which requires all properties to be depreciated, is, in the opinion of the directors, necessary for the accounts to show a true and fair view in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

The depreciation or amortisation (which would, had the provisions of the Act been followed, have reduced profit for the year) is only one of the factors reflected in the annual valuation and the amount attributable to this factor cannot reasonably be separately identified or quantified.

The fixed assets of the business were valued by Weatherall Green and Smith, external valuers, as at 31 December 1993.
