THE DIRECTORS' REPORT

YEAR ENDED 31 MARCH 2013

The directors present their report and the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 March 2013

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND BUSINESS REVIEW

The principal activity of the company is property trading which has remained unchanged during the year and no change is anticipated in the immediate future

The financial results of the company's activities for the year ended 31st March 2013 are fully reflected in the attached financial statements together with the notes thereon

PROPERTIES

The company's trading portfolio was professionally valued by the company's valuers, Colliers International, at 31 March 2012 on the basis of open market value and, at that time, it had a surplus over book value of £1,624,665 (relating to properties still held at 31 March 2013) which has not been incorporated into the financial statements. Had this surplus been incorporated into the financial statements the company would have had a net asset position of approximately £1,391,000

Despite the economic uncertainty, the directors are satisfied that at 31 March 2013 properties held for trading still have a value in excess of their book value

DIRECTORS

The directors who served the company during the year were as follows

Mr B S E Freshwater Mr D Davis

The Articles of Association do not require the directors to retire by rotation

The directors do not have service contracts nor do they receive any emoluments from the company

DIRECTORS' INTERESTS

The whole of the issued share capital of the company is owned by The Raphael Freshwater Memorial Association Limited, a company registered in Great Britain and incorporated in England for charitable purposes Mr B S E Freshwater and Mr D Davis are governors of the parent undertaking but do not have any interest in the share capital of the company, the parent undertaking, or any direct or indirect subsidiary of the parent undertaking

Management services are provided by Highdorn Co Limited and Freshwater Property Management Limited Mr B S E Freshwater is a director of Highdorn Co Limited and has a non-beneficial interest therein Mr B S E Freshwater is also a director of Freshwater Property Management Limited and both he and Mr D Davis are governors of its parent undertaking, Mayfair Charities Limited, but have no beneficial interest in either company

DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

The directors are responsible for preparing the Directors' Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the directors have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). Under company law the directors must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that year.

In preparing those financial statements, the directors are required to

- make judgements and accounting estimates that are reasonable and prudent,
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business

The directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008)

Although there is a deficiency of net assets in the company's financial statements as at 31 March 2013, the directors consider the underlying value of properties held for trading, included in the balance sheet at cost, would in the event of disposal result in a surplus in excess of the deficit as at the balance sheet date

Cash flow statement

The company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008) on the grounds that it is a wholly-owned subsidiary undertaking of the parent undertaking registered in England and Wales which prepares consolidated financial statements that include a consolidated cash flow statement

Related parties transactions

The company has taken advantage of the exemptions in Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008) in order to dispense with the requirement to disclose transactions with other companies in The Raphael Freshwater Memorial Association Limited group

Turnover

Turnover comprises rents and charges receivable and the proceeds from the sale of trading properties less applicable provisions

Stocks

Stocks comprise leasehold and freehold properties held for trading and are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value

Financial instruments

Financial instruments are classified and accounted for, according to the substance of the contractual arrangement, as either financial assets, financial liabilities or equity instruments. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the company after deducting all of its liabilities.

Acquisitions and disposals of properties

Acquisitions and disposals are considered to have taken place at the date of legal completion and are included in the financial statements accordingly

Current tax

Provision is made for consideration payable to or receivable from other group undertakings for the surrender of losses under group relief provisions
