REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS

The Directors have pleasure in presenting their Report together with the Financial Statements of the Company for the year ended 31st March 1999.

BUSINESS REVIEW

The principal activity of the Company is Investment in Listed Securities. There has been no significant change in the nature of the Company's business activities during the year, nor is any envisaged in the immediate future.

RESULTS AND DIVIDEND

The financial results of the Company's activities for the year ended 31st March 1999 are fully reflected in the attached Financial Statements and Explanatory Notes.

An interim dividend of £8,400 (1998: £3,200) has been paid. The Directors do not recommend the payment of a final dividend (1998: £nil).

The Directors are responsible for maintaining proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Company and to enable them to ensure that the Financial Statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. YEAR 2000

The Company is carrying out a detailed review of all its reporting systems and operations with the object of ensuring that they will be Year 2000 compliant. Work has been completed on the core financial and business information systems and is progressing according to schedule in respect of other systems.

The directors are satisfied that on-going reviews are appropriate to ensure that the company's operations will not be adversely affected by the Year 2000 issue. It is envisaged that the financial costs of compliance are not significant to the company.

During the year the Company made no charitable donation nor political contribution (1998 - £Nil).
