#### **DIRECTORS' REPORT**

#### **YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2014**

The directors present their report and the financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 August 2014.

#### **PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES**

The principal activity of the company during the year were those of dealers in caravans and the selling of related parts and accessories.

#### **DIRECTORS**

#### **GOING CONCERN**

The directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue operational existence for the foreseeable future. For this reason the directors continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the annual financial statements.

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#### **NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**

#### **YEAR ENDED 31 AUGUST 2014**

### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, modified to include the revaluation of certain fixed assets, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008).

#### Turnover

The turnover shown in the profit and loss account represents amounts receivable for goods and services provided during the year in the normal course of business, net of trade discounts, VAT and other sales and related taxes.

#### Fixed assets

All fixed assets are initially recorded at cost, other than freehold property which is held at the revalued amount.

#### Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of an asset, less its estimated residual value, over the useful economic life of that asset as follows:

Fixtures and fittings

10% on cost

Motor vehicles
Office equipment

25% on reducing balance 20% on reducing balance

Computer equipment

25% on cost

Freehold land and buildings are depreciated at 2% on carrying value less residual value, however, there has been no charge during the year as the directors believe the residual value is not materially different to the net book value as at 31 August 2014.

#### Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

# Pension costs

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme for employees. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the company. The annual contributions payable are charged to the profit and loss account.

### **Deferred taxation**

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events have occurred at that date that will result in an obligation to pay more, or a right to pay less or to receive more tax, with the following exceptions:

Provision is made for tax on gains arising from the revaluation (and similar fair value adjustments) of fixed assets, and gains on disposal of fixed assets that have been rolled over into replacement assets, only to the extent that, at the balance sheet date, there is a binding agreement to dispose of the assets concerned. However, no provision is made where, on the basis of all available evidence at the balance sheet date, it is more likely than not that the taxable gain will be rolled over into replacement assets and charged to tax only where the replacement assets are sold.

Deferred tax assets are recognised only to the extent that the directors consider that it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the underlying timing differences can be deducted.

Deferred tax is measured on an undiscounted basis at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the periods in which timing differences reverse, based on tax rates and laws enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

#### 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

#### **Financial instruments**

Financial liabilities and equity instruments are classified according to the substance of the contractual arrangements entered into. An equity instrument is any contract that evidences a residual interest in the assets of the entity after deducting all of its financial liabilities.

Where the contractual obligations of financial instruments (including share capital) are equivalent to a similar debt instrument, those financial instruments are classed as financial liabilities. Financial liabilities are presented as such in the balance sheet. Finance costs and gains or losses relating to financial liabilities are included in the profit and loss account. Finance costs are calculated so as to produce a constant rate of return on the outstanding liability.

Where the contractual terms of share capital do not have any terms meeting the definition of a financial liability then this is classed as an equity instrument. Dividends and distributions relating to equity instruments are debited direct to equity.

Abrehart, have controlling interests, and for which both R. F. Tolhurst and D. J. Abrehart are directors. The company involved is Lenham Storage Company Limited.

Total purchases in the period from Lenham Storage Company Limited amounted to £14,729 (2013: £34,817). Included within trade creditors is a balance of £2,671 (2013: £3,973) owed to Lenham Storage Company Limited.

Included within other debtors is a balance of £40,000 owed from Lenham Storage Company Limited (2013: £14,000 owed to Lenham Storage Company Limited).

Dividends were paid to Freightflow International Limited to the sum of £118,500 (2013: £66,630) during the year.

Included within other creditors is a balance of £1,657 (2013: £1,868) owed to Freightflow International Limited.

All of the above transactions were undertaken on an arm's length basis.
