#### Accounts

The directors submit their report and the financial statements for the year ended 28 February 2001.

### Statement of directors' responsibilities

#### 1. Accounting policies

### a) Accounting basis and standards

These accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

### b) Fixed assets and depreciation

Fixed assets are depreciated at rates estimated to write off the cost of the assets over their expected useful lives.

Depreciation has been charged at the following rates per annum:

Freehold buildings - 2% on cost

Plant and machinery - 30% on written down value.

Vehicles - 25% on written down value

### c) Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is accounted for under the liability method in respect of the taxation effects of all timing differences which are expected to reverse in the future calculated at the rate at which it is estimated that tax will be payable.

#### d) Turnover

Turnover represents the invoiced value of services provided
