Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 1996

1 Principal accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards in the United Kingdom. A summary of the more important accounting policies, which have been applied consistently, is set out below.

Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention modified by the revaluation of certain fixed assets.

Turnover

Turnover, all of which originates in the United Kingdom, is the invoiced value of goods and services supplied, excluding VAT.

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Properties are subject to periodic revaluation by qualified surveyors and valuers on an open market, existing use basis, having regard, where appropriate to depreciated replacement cost.

Depreciation on fixed assets is calculated to write off their cost or valuation, less estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives at the following annual rates using the straight line method.

Freehold buildings 2% Plant, equipment and vehicles 33%

No depreciation has been provided on freehold land.

Operating leases

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged on a straight line basis over the term of the lease.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value. Cost includes attributable overheads where appropriate. Net realisable value is the estimated selling price reduced by all costs of completion, marketing, selling and distribution.

Government grants

Government grants relating to tangible fixed assets are treated as deferred income and released to the profit and loss account over the expected useful lives of the assets concerned.

Amdega Limited

Foreign currencies

Assets and liabilities denominated in overseas currencies are translated into sterling at the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Individual transactions are translated at the rate of exchange ruling on the date of transaction. All exchange differences are included in the profit and loss account.

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is provided on timing differences except where the liability is not expected to arise in the foreseeable future. No provision is made for the taxation liability on the revaluation of fixed assets.

Pensions

The majority of the company's employees are members of the Williams Holdings Pension Plan. This plan is funded by contributions partly from the employees and partly from the company at rates determined by an independent actuary. These contributions are invested separately from the company's and the Williams Holdings PLC group assets. The pension costs comprise regular cost less variations calculated in accordance with Statement of Standard Accounting Practice No 24.

Research and development

Expenditure on research and development is written off in the year in which it is incurred.

3 Exceptional cost of sales

During the year, the directors reviewed the basis upon which attributable overheads are absorbed into the valuation of stocks and identified revisions to that basis which would result in a more appropriate valuation of stocks. The application of these revisions resulted in the year end stock valuation being £277,000 lower than it would have been under the previous appropriate method.

The company's tangible fixed assets were revalued at 1 January 1997 by independent valuers on an existing use basis. This exercise produced revised valuations for land and buildings and plant, equipment and vehicles of £2,800,000 and £962,000 respectively, representing an overall increase of £694,000 over net book value. The result of this valuation has not been reflected in these accounts as the directors consider it to be a non-adjusting post balance sheet event.

The deficit of £654,000 on the revaluation reserve as at 1 January 1997 represented a temporary diminution in the valuation of land and buildings arising on valuations performed in prior years. Following the valuation exercise on 1 January 1997, the directors now consider that £496,000 of this deficit has become permanent and accordingly, this amount has been transferred to the profit and loss account reserve.

21 Contingent liabilities

The company is party to a group arrangement with its bankers whereby its in hand balance may be applied against the overdraft of Williams Holdings PLC.

The company is a guarantor, with other group companies, of loans totalling £185m, made by the Newmond group's bankers to Pinco 873 Limited, a fellow subsidiary company.

Guarantees amounting to £116,000 (1995: £148,000) have been given in the normal course of business.

22 Pension costs

The majority of the company's employees are members of the Williams Holdings Pension Plan, which is the principal pension plan operated for employees of the Williams Holdings PLC group. This plan is of the defined benefit type, and costs are assessed with the advice of a qualified actuary using the projected unit method.

The contributions made by the company are based on pension costs across the Williams Holdings PLC group as a whole.

The actuarial method used, the description of the main actuarial assumptions, and the results of the most recent formal valuation including the level of funding are included in the financial statements of Williams Holdings PLC for the year ended 31 December 1996.

An amount of £24,000 (1995; £32,000) is included in other creditors, which represents the excess of the accumulated pension cost over the payment of contributions made.

Subsequent to the year end, pending the establishment of its own scheme, the Newmond group has become a participating employer in the Williams Holdings Pension plan.

23 Parent company

On 31 December 1996, Newmond Limited, a company incorporated in Great Britain, became the ultimate holding company. Copies of the Newmond Limited group financial statements may be obtained from The Secretary, Newmond Limited, 115 - 118 Mariner, Lichfield Industrial Estate, Tamworth, Staffs S79 7UL.

24 Related party transactions

During the year Williams Holdings p.l.c. provided a wide range of services to the company, including finance facilities, property management, treasury advice, pension consultancy and administration and general management which were charged at a full commercial value. The total costs of such services were £377,000.
