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#### TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT

#### FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2004

The Trustees present their annual report with the accounts of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2004.

Subud Britain had a financially successful year in 2004.

The Statement of Financial Activities on page 5 which is the Charity equivalent of a Profit and Loss Account shows the overall movement of funds in the year as a net income of £514,952. This includes the surplus on the sale of the Manchester property of £411,517.

Income from Gift Aid, donations and Hall letting all increased during the year. Amadeus Centre Ltd donated £22,000 in the year. Roof damage to The Amadeus Centre had resulted in no donation in the previous year. Insurance claim monies received by Central London Group in 2004 in relation to part of the repairs to the roof were £36,024. In addition £19,237 was received by the National account. This had been accrued in the 2003 accounts and so does not appear in the 2004 Staement of Financial Activities.

The Scottish Region continued to renovate the property in Perth and £16,783 was spent in the year. A refund of Stamp Duty paid on the purchase of £7,830 was received leaving a net cost in the year of £8,954. The total cost of buying and renovating the property to date is £340,128. This has been financed by the sales proceeds of the Glasgow property of £85,842 and by loans from the Capital Fund of £254,286.

Bank balances totalled £841,109 at 31st December 2004, of which £305,339 (2003 £256,125) was held in Group and Regional accounts, and £437,594 was held on deposit for the purchase of a new Manchester property.

Free cash reserves held at Group, Regional and National levels are all maintained at three months average expenditure.

The charity is a company limited by guarantee and registered as a charity. The governing documents of the charity are the Memorandum and Articles of Association and the Regulations. The full name of the charity is Subud Britain.

#### . ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### Consolidation

The company and its subsidiary comprise a small group. The company has therefore taken advantage of the exemption conferred by S248 of the Companies Act 1985 not to prepare group accounts.

#### Cash flow

The accounts do not include a cash flow statement because the company, as a small reporting entity, is exempt from the requirements to prepare such a statement under Financial Reporting Standard 'Cash flow statements'.

#### Tangible fixed assets

No provision has been made in respect of freehold properties. The directors consider the market value to be in excess of the book value shown in the accounts.

Amortisation calculated by reference to the unexpired portion of leases of the leasehold properties is charged to the property fund.

#### Tax recoverable

Tax recoverable relating to Gift Aid income is taken into account in the year in which it is received.

#### Valuation of investments

Investments held as fixed assets are shown at current valuation.
