#### 1 Accounting policies

#### Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards and under the historical cost accounting rules.

#### Depreciation

Depreciation of fixed assets is calculated to write off their cost or valuation less any residual value over their estimated useful lives as follows:

Freehold land

Freehold buildings

Leasehold land and buildings

Plant and equipment

Nil

2% per annum on straight line

Equally over period of lease

20% per annum on reducing balance

No depreciation is provided on freehold buildings where the estimated remaining useful life exceeds 50 years as any depreciation charged would not be material.

The depreciation rate for freehold buildings with an estimated remaining useful life of less than 50 years has been amended in the year.

#### Government grants

Government grants on capital expenditure are credited to a deferral account and are released to revenue over the expected useful life of the relevant asset by equal annual instalments.

#### Stocks and work in progress

Stocks and work in progress are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

#### Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided on the liability method in respect of the taxation effect of all timing differences to the extent that tax liabilities are likely to crystallise in the foreseeable future.

#### Pensions

#### Defined contribution scheme

Contributions are charged to the profit and loss account as they become payable in accordance with the rules of the scheme.
