DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors have pleasure in presenting their report and the company's accounts for the year ended 31 December 1997.

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The accounts for the year show a loss of £5,235 (1996 - profit of £250,491).

No dividend is recommended by the directors.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY AND REVIEW OF THE BUSINESS

During the year the company continued to act as a casino operator. Turnover for the year was £4,191,031 and the loss before taxation for the year was £5,235.

FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

The company plans to continue its existing activities in forthcoming years.

FIXED ASSETS

The movements in respect of fixed assets during the year are set out in note 9 to the accounts.

SUPPLIER PAYMENT POLICY

The company agrees payment terms for its business transactions when goods and services are ordered. It ensures that suppliers are aware of the terms of payment and the relevant terms are included in contracts where appropriate. Subject to satisfactory performance by the supplier, arrangements are adhered to when making payments.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS

at 31 December 1997

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

Leased assets

Where assets are held under finance leases, the capital element of the rental obligations is included in creditors and assets are held in the balance sheet at cost, being the capital element of rental obligations as at the inception of the lease, less depreciation in accordance with the company's normal accounting policies. The finance charge element of rentals payable is charged to the profit and loss account in proportion to the future obligations outstanding.

Depreciation

Tangible assets which include motor vehicles, equipment and other miscellaneous assets are depreciated on a straight line basis at the following rates:

Plant and equipment – 2–8 years
Refurbishment – 10 years
Motor vehicles – 4 years

These rates are considered appropriate to write down costs to a residual value on a straight line basis over the term of their estimated useful lives.

Stock

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Taxation

Deferred taxation is provided using the liability method in respect of taxation liabilities deferred for any reason to the extent that it is probable such liabilities will crystallise.

Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the rate ruling on the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are retranslated at the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Exchange gains or losses arising on translation are reported as part of the operating result of the year.

Pension fund

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. The pension charge for the year represents contributions payable by the company to the fund and amounted to £10,942 (1996 - £13,360). Contributions amounting to £2,093 were payable to the fund at the end of the year and are included in creditors (1996 - £5,171).

2. TURNOVER

Turnover represents membership subscriptions, gaming wins and catering receipts net of Value Added Tax and before deduction of Gaming Duty. All turnover is derived within the United Kingdom.

19. CONTINGENT LIABILITY

The company has jointly and severally guaranteed the Value Added Tax liability of other Ladbroke Group undertakings within the group registration, amounting to approximately £6,458,000 as at 31 December 1997 (1996 – £5,456,000).

Under the terms of a cross guarantee agreement, the company has jointly and severally guaranteed the liabilities of certain other Ladbroke Group undertakings in respect of their current accounts held with a UK clearing bank. The amount under the guarantee is limited to any credit balances on current accounts held by the company with these banks. At 31 December 1997 the aggregate amount of such credit balances was £1,069,644 (1996 – £620,827).

20. CASH FLOW STATEMENT

The company has taken advantage of FRS1 which exempts subsidiaries from preparing a cash flow statement where 90% or more of the voting rights are controlled within the group. The ultimate parent undertaking, Ladbroke Group PLC, has included the required consolidated cash flow statement within its consolidated financial statements.

21. RELATED PARTIES

The company has taken advantage of FRS 8, which exempts subsidiary undertakings, 90% or more of whose voting rights are controlled within the group, from disclosing transactions with entities that are part of the group or investees of the group qualifying as related parties. The accounts of the ultimate parent undertaking Ladbroke Group PLC are publicly available.

22. ULTIMATE PARENT UNDERTAKING

These accounts are consolidated in the group accounts of the ultimate parent undertaking which is Ladbroke Group PLC, a company registered in England and Wales, the accounts of which are available from the registered office of that company at Maple Court, Central Park, Reeds Crescent, Watford, Herts WD1 1HZ.

Ladbroke Group PLC is the parent undertaking of the only group of undertakings for which group accounts are prepared and of which the company is a member.

The company's immediate parent is Ladbroke Casinos Limited, a company registered in England and Wales.
