### **DIRECTORS' REPORT for 2002**

to be PRESENTED to the
ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING
to be HELD on THURSDAY 24th APRIL 2003

The Directors have pleasure in presenting their report and financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2002. The Society was incorporated on 14 November 1967, under the Companies Acts, as consolidated by the Companies Act 1985, as a company limited by guarantee and not having a share capital. The Society is also a registered charity. It traces its history continuously from the Croydon Microscopical Club (1870 - 1877), the Croydon Microscopical and Natural History Club (1877 - 1901), and the unincorporated Croydon Natural History and Scientific Society (1901 - 1967). The principal activity of the Society is, for the public benefit, the encouragement of the study of the natural and local history and archaeology of the Croydon area, by organising lectures, talks, discussions, exhibitions, field-excursions, and surveys; by issuing publications; by maintaining a library; and by maintaining or participating in the maintenance of a museum. These aims have been pursued, during the year, chiefly through our library accessions, meetings, museum work, and publishing programmes.

### **LIBRARY**

Use of the library has increased this year, with a wide range of enquiries relating to many aspects of local geology, archaeology, local and natural history, and even psychology. A higher proportion of users have been Society members. Much use of the library has been made, in particular, in connection with archaeological, botanical, geological, local and industrial history and ornithological researchers in connection with planned publications. The card index system has been entirely overhauled by Christine Chin, and a substantial start made on filing a backlog of cards. Data from cards for selected topics are being extracted and stored electronically off site. The majority of library items, especially books, journals, maps and plans, and small pamphlets, can be found

relatively quickly. Large pamphlets, however, have yet to be filed systematically, and are thus currently more difficult to locate.

Responses to enquiries which have required some research now often form the basis for additional titles in the Croydon Bibliographies for Regional Survey series, or in a new Site Files series. Very limited numbers of paper copies of these documents are circulated, but all are published on the Society's web site.

### MUSEUM

Cataloguing of the palaeontology collections has continued. Loans of items for the East Surrey Museum display stimulated the transfer additional records for the industrial archaeology collection to the computer. Re-housing the archaeology collection continues, and the Museum volunteers will shortly be working on the local Croydon material.

### **PUBLICATIONS and WEB SITE**

Bibliographies, Bulletins, Programmes, and Site Files have been issued during the year. The Society's archives web site continues to be its main Web presence, www.greig51.freeserve.co.uk/cnhss and continues to attract enquiries.

### **EXHIBITIONS**

The Society assisted the Wealden Cave and Mine Society with the loan of museum items for a temporary exhibition devoted, largely, to the archaeology and history of east Surrey's mines and underground quarries at the East Surrey Museum at Caterham, from January to May.

### RESEARCH

In May the Botany and Geology Sections met, along with members of the Surrey Flora Committee, on Croham Hurst. Extra records were made both for the locations of uncommon plants, and the distribution of all plants. One member has been assisted with a planned book on the birds of east Surrey. Members of the Industrial Studies Section have continued work on an industrial archaeology guide for Croydon, intended to be published by the Surrey Industrial History Group, and have commenced submitting entries for the Greater London Industrial Archaeology Society's Industrial Archaeology database for London.

### CONSERVATION and PLANNING

The Society, through its membership of the Association of Croydon Conservation Societies, contributes to Croydon's strategy for nature conservation and management of its open spaces. Croydon Council's Nature Conservation Consultative Panel has been succeeded by Greenlink, and has met three times in 2002. During the year we have commented on planning applications including

those for the grounds of Addington Palace, the proposed leisure complex on Metropolitan Open Land in South Norwood and the review of the Croydon Plan (formerly the Unitary Development Plan).

The Industrial Studies Section has advised Reigate & Banstead District Council on the archaeological value of the silver sand mines below Reigate Castle, and liaised with English Heritage concerning the review of this Scheduled Ancient Monument under that body's Monuments Protection Programme. English Heritage have confirmed that the mines form an integral part of the Scheduled Ancient Monument.

### ACCOMMODATION

The Society continues to experience difficulty in realising its full potential within Croydon's cultural scene as a result of the lack of accommodation for its various activities at a single readily accessible location. It has, instead, to hire rooms at East Croydon for meetings, whilst leasing accommodation for museum work and storage at two locations, and owning the freehold of a fourth building where the library is stored. A proposal has been submitted to Croydon Council for the use of a part of the current Ashburton Public Library premises, when these are vacated, to allow library and museum functions to be brought together under a single roof.

The Society's Accounts and our Accountants' Report are appended, and show an excess of income over expenditure.

### MEMBERSHIP

At 31 December 2002 there were 432 members, a decrease of 19 during the year. These included 276 ordinary, 89 associate, 38 life, 21 group and 8 honorary members. We regret to report the deaths of Sylvia Ashby, Roy Billington, Mary Pardoe, Dorothy Sarah Peake, Alan B.L. Reid (an Honorary Member), John Riley, John Sherwood (an Honorary Member), Aileen Turner and Barbara Whitley.

### 1) Accounting policies

These accounts have been prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention. The following accounting policies have been applied and are in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

### Depreciation

Depreciation is calculated to spread the cost of the following assets over their estimated useful lives at the following rates:

Stocks and investments are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

### Government grants
