DIRECTORS' REPORT for 1998

The Directors have pleasure in presenting their report and the financial statements of the Society's Council for the year ended 31 December 1998. The Society was incorporated on 14 November 1967, under the Companies Acts, as consolidated by the Companies Act 1985, as a company limited by guarantee and not having a share capital. The Society is also a registered charity. Its traces its history continuously from the Croydon Microscopical Club (1870 - 1877), the Croydon Microscopical and Natural History Club (1877 - 1901), and the unincorporated Croydon Natural History and Scientific Society (1901 - 1967).

The principal activity of the Society is, for the public benefit, the encouragement of the study of the natural and local history and archaeology of the Croydon area, by organisation lectures, talks, discussions, exhibitions, field-excursions, and surveys; by issuing publications; by maintaining a library; and by maintaining or participating in the maintenance of a museum. These aims have been pursued, during the year, chiefly through our library accessions, meetings, museum work, and publishing programmes.

LIBRARY

The library has continued to function, responding to numerous postal requests for information, amongst which during the year have been requests for biographical information concerning former members for the current revision of the Dictionary of National Biography, and for information concerning the Society's important pioneering work in geographical fieldwork. Publication dates for the Society's Regional Survey Atlas of Croydon and District (1936 - 62) have been established (such dates were not printed in the five issued collections of parts.)

MUSEUM

Mrs Mary Saaler resigned as Hon. Curator during the year on health grounds, and has been replaced by Mr. Kenneth E. Woodhams. The Museum's working party has continued to meet regularly. Computerisation of the Museum catalogues has been assisted by the donation to the Society of a second computer, surplus to the needs of the Croydon Borough's Museum Service. This is a part of a programme of collaboration with the Borough service, which includes the extension of the agreed loan period for a number of the Society's specimens currently on display in the Lifetimes Gallery at Croydon Clocktower. The Society's lease on the Museum site has been extended by agreement with the London Borough of Croydon.

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CROHAM HURST SURVEY

The Geology Section has re-vitalised the Croham Hurst Survey, and held regular recording and mapping field sessions on the Hurst.

CONSERVATION and PLANNING

The Society, through its association with the Association of Croydon Conservation Societies (ACCS) and representation on the LB Croydon's Nature Conservation Consultative Panel, contributed to the Borough's forthcoming Nature Conservation Strategy; monitored the environmental impact of Tramlink works; provided support for the non-implementation of the proposed denotification of part of the Croham Hurst Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) by English Nature; and contributed to a systematic needs of pond management throughout the Borough.

The Geology Section has contributed to the Corporation of London's work in assessing the potential and future use of the Rose and Crown chalk pit at Riddlesdown; and has worked in association with the South London Regionally Important Geological Sites [RIGS] Group, with a view to two sites within the Borough being RIGS-listed.

Members of the Industrial Studies Section have liaised with the Historic Royal Palaces Agency in connection with a research project concerning Reigate stone; and have continued to contribute evidence concerning lime-kilns and stone-quarries to English Heritage's Monuments Protection Programme, with the likely result that important structures at Betchworth and Brockham will be added to the statutory Schedule of Ancient Monuments.

MEMBERSHIP

At 31 December 1998 there were 443 members, a decrease of 37 during the year. We regret to record the deaths of Peter Glover and Lilian Thornhill (both Honorary Members), and Francis Waller (who left a bequest to the Society.) Dr. Ronald C.W. Cox and Mrs. Pamela F. Collins were elected Honorary Members.
