NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2015

1. Statutory information

Laserperformance (Europe) Limited is a private company, limited by shares, registered in England and Wales. The company's registered number and registered office address can be found on the Company Information page.

2. Accounting policies

Basis of preparing the financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of Section 1A "Small Entities" of Financial Reporting Standard 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Related party exemption

The company has taken advantage of exemption, under the terms of Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland', not to disclose related party transactions with wholly owned subsidiaries within the group.

Turnover

Turnover is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable, net of discounts, rebates, value added tax and other sales taxes.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery etc

- at varying rates on cost

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value, after making due allowance for obsolete and slow moving items.

Deferred tax

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date.

Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to profit or loss on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

8. Contingent liabilities

The company has entered into a guarantee along with its holding company, Full Moon Holdings Limited and its fellow subsidiary Laser Sailboats Limited, in favour of Barclays Bank plc, to secure the bank borrowings of these group companies. At 31 December 2015 these borrowings amounted to £nil (2014 - £103,993). The obligations to Barclays have been repaid in full and the associated guarantees have been removed.

The Company is subject to pending litigation in respect of, inter alia, licensing claims and contract. No damages have been specified. The company believes the case is without merit and will likely be dismissed.

9. Other financial commitments

Total financial commitments, guarantees and contingencies which are not included in the balance sheet amount to £537,594 (2014 - £807,696).

10. APB ethical standard - provisions available for small entities

In common with many other businesses of our size and nature we use our auditors to prepare and submit returns to the tax authorities and assist with the preparation of the financial statements.

11. Ultimate controlling party

The controlling party is Full Moon Holdings Limited.

The ultimate controlling party is Sima Rastegar.

12. Going concern basis

The financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis, which assumes that the company will continue to trade for the foreseeable future. During the year the company made a net loss of £1,528,209. At that date the company had net liabilities of £1,428,917.

The company has continued to rely on the support of other group companies which has enabled it to meet its liabilities as they fall due.

The director has considered the working capital needs of the business for the twelve month period from approval of these financial statements and has concluded that with the on-going support of its shareholders, the company will be able to meet its liabilities as they fall due. The director has factored this key assumption into his review of funding needs and forecasts for the forthcoming period. On this basis, the director considers that the company will continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future and accordingly the director considers it appropriate to prepare financial statements on the going concern basis. The financial statements do not include any adjustments that might arise if the going concern basis is not appropriate.
