DIRECTORS' REPORT For the period ended 29 September 2006

The directors present their report and the audited consolidated financial statements of BlackRock Group Limited (formerly Merrill Lynch Investment Managers Group Limited) (the "Company" and together with its subsidiaries the "Group") and the audited Company balance sheet for the period ended 29 September 2006.

STATEMENT OF DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

The directors are responsible for preparing the annual report and the financial statements. The directors have chosen to prepare the accounts for the Company in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (UK GAAP).

United Kingdom company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Company and the Group as at the end of the financial year and of the profit or loss of the Group for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Group will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Company and the Group and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for the system of internal control, for safeguarding the assets of the Company and the Group and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Each of the persons who is a director at the date of approval of this report confirms that:

- (A) so far as the director is aware, there is no relevant audit information of which the company's auditors are unaware; and
- (B) the director has taken all the steps he/she ought to have taken as a director in order to make himself/herself aware of any relevant audit information and to establish that the company's auditors are aware of that information.

This confirmation is given and should be interpreted in accordance with the provisions of s234ZA of the Companies Act 1985.

BUSINESS REVIEW AND PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

At the period end the company was a wholly owned subsidiary of BlackRock Inc..

On 29 September 2006, Merrill Lynch & Co. transferred its investment management business to BlackRock, Inc.. Merrill Lynch Investment Managers Group Limited was one of the subsidiaries sold to BlackRock, Inc. and renamed on 2 October 2006 to BlackRock Group Limited.

The Company acts as the United Kingdom holding company for the BlackRock group of companies (formerly the Merrill Lynch Investment Managers group of companies). The Group is engaged in the provision of investment management and advisory services. There have not been any significant changes in the group's principal activities in the period under review. The directors propose that the principal activities will continue during 2006 and 2007.

As shown in the Group's profit and loss account on page 6, the group's turnover for the period ended 29 September 2006 was £466,070,000 (30 December 2005 - £407,524,000). On an annualised basis this has increased by 52%. This is in line with management's expectations.

The Group's balance sheet on page 8 of the financial statements as at 29 September 2006 shows net assets of £233,911,000 (30 December 2005 - £907,966,000), a decrease of 74%. This is in line with management's expectations and is principally driven by the payment of dividends and disposal of subsidiary undertakings following a group reorganisation (see note 4).

DIRECTORS' REPORT For the period ended 29 September 2006

Principal Risks and Uncertainities

Principal risks and uncertainities are managed by "BlackRock" at a global level.

As a leading investment management firm risk is an inherent part of BlackRock's business. Global markets, by their nature, are prone to uncertainty and subject participants to a variety of risks. BlackRock devotes significant resources across all of its operations to identifying, measuring, monitoring, managing and analysing market and operating risks, including investments in personnel and technology.

The specific risks and uncertainties relevant to the Company include:

- Change in securities markets could lead to a decline in revenues
- Poor investment performance could lead to the loss of clients and a decline in revenues
- Loss of key employees could lead to the loss of clients and a decline in revenues
- Loss of significant separate accounts could decrease revenues
- Competitive fee pressures could reduce revenues and profit margins
- Performance fees may increase earnings volatility, which could decrease BlackRock's stock price
- Failure to maintain adequate infrastructure could impede BlackRock's ability to support business growth
- BlackRock has become subject to an increased risk of asset volatility from changes in the global financial and equity markets
- Failure to comply with government regulations could result in fines or temporary or permanent prohibitions on business activities

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The Group's loss for the period, after taxation, amounted to £261,333,000 (2005 - profit £106,234,000) . During the period the Company paid dividends of £411,759,000 (2005 - £nil) .

The directors had no beneficial interests in the shares of the Company or any other United Kingdom affiliated company at 29 September 2006 or at anytime during the period then ended.

POLITICAL AND CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTIONS

The total sum donated during the period by the Group to charitable organisations was £75,000 (2005: £280,000). The Group matches contributions made by all United Kingdom employees under a Give As You Earn scheme and donations made by employees to certain specified charities. There were no political donations made during the period (2005: £nil).

EMPLOYEE INVOLVEMENT

It is the Group's policy that there should be effective communication with all employees who, subject to practical and commercial considerations, should be consulted on and involved in decisions that affect their current jobs or future prospects.

DIRECTORS' REPORT For the period ended 29 September 2006

DISABLED EMPLOYEES

Applications for employment by disabled persons are fully and fairly considered having regard to the aptitudes and abilities of each applicant. The Group's policy is to enable any employees who become disabled during their employment to continue their careers within the Group. Training, career development and promotion of disabled persons is, to the extent possible, identical to that of other employees who are not disabled.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The Group is exposed to price, credit and liquidity risk in relation to certain investments included in note 16. These risks are not hedged.

AUDITORS

The Company has elected to dispense with the obligation to appoint auditors annually and, accordingly, Deloitte & Touche LLP is deemed to be reappointed for a further term under the provisions of section 386(2) of the Companies Act 1985.

We have audited the group and parent company financial statements (the "financial statements") of BlackRock Group Limited (formerly Merrill Lynch Investment Managers Group Limited) for the 39 week period ended 29 September 2006 which comprise the consolidated profit and loss account, the consolidated statement of total recognised gains and losses, the consolidated balance sheet, the Company balance sheet and the related notes 1 to 28. These financial statements have been prepared under the accounting policies set out therein.

Our responsibility is to audit the financial statements in accordance with relevant legal and regulatory requirements and International Standards on Auditing (UK and Ireland).

We report to you our opinion as to whether the financial statements give a true and fair view and are properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985. We also report to you whether, in our opinion, the information given in the Directors' report is consistent with the financial statements.

In addition we report to you if, in our opinion, the Group has not kept proper accounting records, if we have not received all the information and explanations we require for our audit, or if information specified by law regarding directors' remuneration and other transactions with the Company and other members of the Group is not disclosed.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS For the period ended 29 September 2006

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom law and accounting standards.

1.2 Accounting period

The Company's financial period consisted of a thirty-nine (2005: fifty-two) week period ending on the last Friday in September (2005: 30 December).

1.3 Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

1.4 Basis of consolidation

All subsidiary undertakings have been accounted for under acquisition accounting principles. Goodwill arising on consolidation of subsidiary undertakings, being the excess of the cost of the investment over the fair value of the Group's share of identifiable net assets at the date of acquisition, is capitalised.

The results of subsidiaries acquired during the period are included from the effective date of acquisition.

The results of subsidiaries sold are included up to the effective date of disposal.

1.5 Cash flow

The Company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement under Financial Reporting Standard 1 (Revised 1996) - Cash Flow Statements, as a consolidated cash flow statement is included in the publicly available consolidated financial statements of the former ultimate parent company, Merrill Lynch & Co., Inc.

For subsequent transactions a consolidated cash flow statement is included in the publicly available consolidated financial statements of the ultimate parent company, BlackRock, Inc..

1.6 Investments

Associated undertakings

In the Group financial statements, investments in associates are accounted for using the equity method. Associated undertakings are those companies, not being subsidiary undertakings, whose directors include representatives of the Group who participate in the management and operations of those companies, and where the Group has an interest in the equity share capital of between 20% and 50%.

Listed investments

Securities held as fixed asset investments are valued at market price at the close of business on the balance sheet date. The difference between cost and market valuation on the securities, net of any gains or losses arising on any related hedges, is reflected as a movement in reserves.

Fixed asset investments

Investments held as fixed assets are stated at cost less provision for impairment.

Current asset investments

Investments held as current assets are shown at the lower of cost and market value.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS For the period ended 29 September 2006

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

1.7 Turnover

Turnover represents investment management fees arising from investment management and advisory services activity and net proceeds on the sale and liquidation of units in unit trusts.

1.8 Intangible fixed assets

Goodwill arising on the acquisition of subsidiary undertakings represents the excess of cost over fair value of the net tangible assets acquired. Goodwill is capitalised within intangible fixed assets and amortised on a straight line basis over its estimated useful life, which is 20 years.

1.9 Leased assets

All leases are operating leases and the annual rentals are charged to the profit and loss account in the accounting period to which they relate.

1.10 Depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost and are written down to their estimated residual value on a straight line basis over their expected useful lives, as follows:

Leasehold improvements

Ten years or term of lease if shorter

Motor vehicles

- Four years

Furniture and fittings
Office equipment

Three to five yearsThree to five years

1.11 Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is recognised as a liability or an asset if, prior to the balance sheet date, the Company or Group has entered into transactions or events have occurred that give rise to timing differences giving the Company or Group an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future. Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is regarded more likely than not that they will be recovered. Timing differences arise from the inclusion of items of income and expenditure in taxation computations in periods different to those in which they are included in the financial statements.

1.12 Life assurance

Investments held to cover linked long term insurance liabilities are stated at offer price, calculated on 2 January 2007, which is considered to be the current market value.

The technical provision for linked liabilities is established by reference to the market value of the underlying assets which are held to meet those liabilities.

1.13 Translation of foreign currencies

Revenues and expenses arising from transactions to be settled in foreign currencies are translated into Sterling at average monthly market rates of exchange. Monetary assets and liabilities are translated into Sterling at the market rates of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date. Exchange differences arising from the translation of foreign currencies are reflected in the profit and loss account.

The financial statements of subsidiaries whose functional currency is not Sterling are translated into Sterling at the closing rate for the balance sheet and at the average rate of exchange for the period for the profit and loss account. Translation differences arising on the profit and loss for the current period and on opening net assets of the subsidiaries are reflected in the statement of total recognised gains and losses and as a movement in reserves.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS For the period ended 29 September 2006

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

1.14 Pensions

The Group participated in a number of defined benefit and defined contribution pension schemes throughout Europe. The schemes were funded with the assets held in separate trustee administered funds.

The major defined benefit scheme was the Merrill Lynch (UK) Pension Plan ("the Plan", formerly the Merrill Lynch (UK) Final Salary Plan), which was closed to new entrants with effect from 30 June 1997 and to contributions from existing members with effect from 30 June 2004. The funding cost relating to the Plan was assessed in accordance with the advice of independent qualified actuaries using the projected unit method. The Group was one of a number of Merrill Lynch employers based in the United Kingdom which participated in the Plan. The Group had been unable to identify its share of the underlying assets and liabilities of the Plan and accordingly accounted for the Plan as if it were a defined contribution scheme.

The major defined contribution scheme was the Merrill Lynch (UK) Defined Contribution Plan. The costs of defined contribution schemes are a percentage of each employee's annual salary based on their age and length of service with the Group and are charged to the profit and loss account in the period in which they fall due.

During the period these schemes were disposed of as part of the group reorganisation (see note 4).

The Group now operates a defined contribution scheme called the BlackRock Group Personal Pension Scheme. The costs of defined contribution schemes are a percentage of each employee's annual salary based on their age and length of service with the Group and are charged to the profit and loss account in the period in which they fall due.

1.15 Other post retirement benefits

The cost of providing post retirement benefits other than pensions is charged to the profit and loss account so as to spread the cost over the estimated average remaining expected service life of employees, based on advice from external actuaries.

Dividend Rights

Subject to the Company having profits available for distribution in accordance with the Companies Act 1985, on 30 June and 31 December each year but conditional upon the directors having resolved to pay such a dividend (without the need for declaration of a dividend by the Company in general meeting), the Company will pay to the holders of the Participating Preference Shares a fixed preferential dividend of 5.5p for each Participating Preference Share held on that date provided that a regulatory deficit would not thereby occur.

In the event that on a dividend payment date the Company has insufficient distributable profits to pay any fixed dividend or to the extent that to pay such dividend would cause a regulatory deficit to occur the Company shall, conditional upon the directors having resolved to pay such a dividend, pay by way of dividend the maximum amounts it may pay from such reserves and without causing a regulatory deficit to occur to the holders of the Participating Preference Shares pro rata to the number of such shares they may hold on that date.

Any amount of fixed preferential dividend not paid for any reason whatsoever shall accumulate and be paid as part of the fixed dividend on the next payment date.

Return of Capital Rights, Variation of Class Rights
