Directors' report

The directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2011

This Directors' Report has been prepared in accordance with the special provisions relating to small companies under the Companies Act 2006

Business review and principle activities

The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of WPP plc and previously operated as part of the group's Advertising and Media Investment Management sector

The company did not trade in 2011 following the cessation of its business operation on 1 July 2006. The principal activities of the company until 1 July 2006 were to act as advertising agents and consultants in the UK and the rest of the world. The Directors are continuing to explore other opportunities for the company but do not currently expect the company to trade in the foreseeable future.

The profit and loss account on page 6 of the financial statements discloses a profit for the year after taxation of £86,873 (2010 £160,021) The profit for the year is primarily due to the release of aged creditor balances

The balance sheet on page 7 of the financial statements shows that the company is in a net current asset financial position at the year end, consistent with the prior year

No dividends were declared in the year ended 31 December 2011 (2010 £nil)

Directors

The directors of the company during the year and subsequent to the year end are set out on page 1

Going concern

After making enquiries, the Directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, they have adopted the going concern basis in preparing the financial statements.

Further details regarding the adoption of the going concern basis can be found in the Statement of accounting policies in the financial statements (Note 1)

1. Accounting policies

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards. The particular accounting policies adopted are described below

Accounting convention

The accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention

Going concern

The company currently has £3 million cash and net assets of £3 million. In determining if the business is a going concern, the Directors have considered the Company's financial position, future prospects, cash flows, liquidity and contingent liabilities. After making enquiries, the Directors have a reasonable expectation that the Company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, they have adopted the going concern basis in preparing the accounts

Cash flow statement.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption under Financial Reporting Standard 1 (revised 1996) not to prepare a cash flow statement as it is a wholly-owned subsidiary of WPP plc, which prepares consolidated financial statements, including a cash flow statement, which are publicly available

Debtors

Debtors are stated net of provisions for bad and doubtful debts

Current tax

Current tax is provided on amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date

Deferred tax

Deferred taxation is provided in full on timing differences that result in an obligation at the balance sheet date to pay more tax, or a right to pay less tax, at a future date at rates expected to apply when they crystallise based on tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date. Timing differences arise from the inclusion of items of income and expenditure in taxation computations in periods different from those in which they are included in financial statements.

6. Taxation

i) Current taxation

i) Factors that may affect future tax charge

The Finance (No 3) Act 2011, which became law on 19 July 2011, includes legislation reducing the main rate of corporation tax from 26% to 25% from 1 April 2012 However, on 21 March 2012, the UK government announced in the 2012 Budget that there will be a further reduction in the corporation tax rate to 24% from 1 April 2012, with additional 1% reductions to 22% by 1 April 2014. The announcements were not substantively enacted at the balance sheet date and therefore have not been reflected in the financial statements.

The directors regard Garrott Dorland Crawford Holdings Limited, a company incorporated in England and Wales, as the immediate parent company and WPP plc, a company registered in Jersey, as the ultimate parent company and the ultimate controlling party
