Business Review & Directors' Report

The directors present their report together with the audited financial statements for the year ended 31st December 2010

Business Review and Principal Activities

Bibby Holdings Limited (the group) is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Bibby Line Group Limited and acts as the managing company for Bibby Line Group Limited's developing businesses portfolio. The group's principal activity is the management and development of businesses up to a scale where they can become direct divisions of Bibby Line Group Limited.

The current group activities comprise two business units. The marine business unit owns, operates and manages floating accommodation units and has a worldwide crewing and shipping technical management business, alongside investing in specialist niche marine assets. The plant hire business unit specialises in the hire of equipment to the utilities, road, rail and construction sector. The group also has a participating interest in Foreland Shipping Limited, a business that owns six roll on, roll off vessels. The group manages, on behalf of its parent company, the woodland burial parks business and the employment law and health and safety compliance business owned by its parent company. At the date of this report, the directors are not aware of any likely major changes in the group's activities in the next year.

Note 1 to the financial statements demonstrates why the directors have prepared these financial statements' on a going concern basis

The group manages its operations on a divisional basis. For this reason, the group's directors believe that non-financial key performance indicators for the group are not necessary or appropriate for an understanding of the development, performance or position of the group. The non-financial performance of the constituents of the group is discussed in the Business Reviews and Directors' Reports of the companies making up this division. The group's key financial KPI's are sales, gross margin, working capital ratios and operating cashflows which are self evident in the financial statements, and more detail is available should this be required in the individual financial statements of the businesses managed.

Principal risks and uncertainties

Competitive pressure in international markets is a continuing risk for the Marine business unit, while the domestic construction market and the general economic outlook are risks to the plant hire business unit. To manage these risks, both business units strive to provide well maintained and safe assets, to offer added value services, to provide prompt responses to customer queries and maintain strong customers relationships. The Marine business unit provides assets and services into international markets and is, therefore, exposed to currency movements on such sales, which it manages through matching costs in the same currencies. The group is financed by floating rate bank loans and is exposed to interest rate movements, managed in part through interest rate swaps, and for one loan, currency rate movements. The group does not hold or issue derivatives and other financial instruments for speculative purposes.

Corporate Governance

The group strives to maintain the highest standards in corporate governance and bases its actions on the principles of openness, integrity and accountability. Audit and Remuneration committees exist within Bibby Line Group Limited which also cover the activities of this group.

Environment

The group recognises the importance of its environmental responsibilities, monitors its impact on the environment, and designs and implements policies to mitigate any adverse impact that might be caused by its activities. Initiatives aimed at minimising the group's impact on the environment include recycling and reducing energy consumption.

Employees

The group is committed to the continuing development of effective employee communication, including regular publication of company magazines lt is the policy of the group to ensure that all sections of the community have an equal opportunity in matters related to employment. The group operates no pension schemes, but is a member of its parent company's schemes. It is the group's policy to promote the understanding and involvement of all employees in its business aims and performance.

The policy of the group is to give full and fair consideration to applications for employment made by disabled persons. If any employee becomes disabled whilst employed by a group company, every effort is made to find suitable continuing employment, with re-training as necessary. Disabled persons share equally in the opportunities available for training, career development and promotion.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2010

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparation

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. They have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding year. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable laws and Accounting Standards.

Basis of consolidation

The group financial statements consolidate the financial statements of the Parent Company and all its subsidiaries by the acquisition method of accounting. A joint venture is an undertaking in which the group has a long term interest and over which it exercises joint control. The consolidated profit and loss account includes the group's share of the results of joint ventures as shown by their audited statements or unaudited management accounts. The group's interest in their net assets is included in the consolidated balance sheet. The consolidation includes the audited accounts of Garic Limited to 30 April 2010, and then the management account information to 31 December 2010. All other subsidiaries have co-terminus year-ends.

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Fixed assets are included at cost, less depreciation. Depreciation is provided on a straight line basis to write off the cost of tangible fixed assets over their expected useful economic lives. The useful economic are as follows.

- equipment - varying rates between three and five years

- leasehold improvements - over the primary period of the lease

fleet - between five and ten years

Fleet assets in the course of construction are not depreciated until it is deemed that the asset has commenced its useful economic life and contributes economic benefits to the group

Interest rate swaps

The Group uses derivative financial instruments to reduce exposure to interest rate movements. For an interest rate swap to be treated as a hedge the instrument must be related to actual assets or liabilities or a probable commitment and must change the nature of the interest rate by converting a fixed rate to a variable rate or vice versa. Interest differentials under these swaps are recognised by adjusting new interest payable over the periods of the contracts. If an instrument ceases to be accounted for as a hedge, for example because the underlying hedged position is eliminated, the instrument is marked to market and any resulting profit or loss recognised at that time

Bank borrowings

Interest-bearing bank loans and overdrafts are recorded at the proceeds received, net of direct issue costs. Finance charges, including premiums payable on settlement or redemption and direct issue costs, are accounted for on an accruals basis in the profit or loss account using the effective interest method and are added to the carrying amount of the instrument to the extent that they are not settled in the period in which they arise

Intangible assets - goodwill

Goodwill arising on the acquisition of subsidiary undertakings and businesses, representing any excess of the fair value of the consideration given over the fair value of the identifiable assets and liabilities acquired, is capitalised and written off on a straight line basis over its useful economic life, which is assessed on an acquisition by acquisition basis. Provision is made for any impairment

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2010 (CONTINUED)

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis

The group's business activities, together with the factors likely to affect its future development, performance and position are set out in the Directors' Report along with the financial position of the group. In addition, the Directors' Report includes the group's policies and processes for managing its capital and financial risk management objectives.

The group meets its day to day working capital requirements through managing its debtors and creditors and has given loans to support other group companies. At the year-end the group has loaned £0 985m to Colney Memorial Parks Limited and £0 75m to Bibby Consulting & Support Limited, both on commercial terms

The group's forecasts and projections, taking account of reasonably possible changes in trading performance given the current uncertain economic outlook and taking account of certain specific financial assurances from the parent company, show the group should be able to operate within the level of its current facilities for a period of at least 12 months from the approval of the financial statements. No matters have been drawn to the group's attention to suggest that required facilities will not be forthcoming on acceptable terms.

After making enquiries, the directors have a reasonable expectation that the company and the group have adequate resources to continue operating on a commercial basis for the foreseeable future. Accordingly, they continue to adopt the going concern basis in preparing the annual accounts

Drydock costs

For all owned vessels non-capital costs associated with the periodic drydocking of vessels are written off in the year in which the drydock takes place

Floating accommodation vessels' relocation and refurbishment costs

After a floating accommodation vessel completes a contract, the costs of relocation and refurbishment are normally written off over the life of that vessel's next contract. However, if the next contract is of a short term nature, the costs are written off to the profit and loss account in the year of expenditure.

Stock

Stock is stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value, and represents consumables, transit vans in the course of conversion

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax is recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed at the balance sheet date where transactions or events that result in an obligation to pay more tax in the future or a right to pay less tax in the future have occurred at the balance sheet date. The deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted. Deferred tax assets are regarded as recoverable and recognised in the financial statements when, on the basis of available evidence, it is more likely than not that there will be suitable taxable profits from which the future reversal of the timing differences can be deducted.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2010 (CONTINUED)

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Current taxation

Current taxation is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using tax rates and laws that have been enacted, or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date

Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are translated at the exchange rate ruling at the date of the transaction. Monetary assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated at the rates ruling at the balance sheet date. All exchange differences are dealt with through the profit and loss account.

Pension costs

Bibby Holdings Limited is a member of the Bibby Line Group Limited Pension Scheme but is unable to identify its share of the underlying assets and liabilities of the Schemes on a consistent and reasonable basis therefore, as required by FRS 17 "Retirement Benefits", Bibby Holdings Limited continues to account for the Scheme as if it were a defined contribution scheme. As a result, the amount charged to the profit and loss account represents the contributions payable to the Scheme in respect of the accounting period. Differences between the amounts charged in the profit and loss account and payments made to the Schemes are treated as liabilities. The disclosures required by FRS 17 have been incorporated in note 28.

Bibby Holdings Limited is a member of the Merchant Navy Officers Pension Fund (MNOPF), but is unable to identify its share of the underlying assets and liabilities of the scheme on a consistent and reasonable basis. As required by FRS 17 "Retirement Benefits", Bibby Holdings Limited continues to account for the scheme as if it were a defined contribution scheme. The membership of the scheme is as a result of historical and current shipping activity.

Operating leases

Lease rentals are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the lease terms

Fixed asset investments

Fixed asset investments are shown at cost less provision for impairment

Finance leases

Amounts due under finance leases are included as a debtor at the amount of the net investment in the lease. Lease payments receivable are apportioned between repayments of capital and interest so as to give a constant periodic rate of return on the net investment in the lease.

2 TURNOVER

Marine turnover, which is derived from international business, is the freight and charter hire earned plus service revenues and is recognised at the time the relevant service is provided to customers. Joint venture turnover includes interest receivable under finance leases. Plant hire turnover is hire rental and is recognised for each period where rentals fall due. The directors consider all material activities of the group to be managed within the UK.

28 PENSION COSTS

The Group participates in the Bibby Line Group Pension Scheme (the "Scheme"), a defined benefit pension scheme. The assets of the Scheme are held separately from those of the sponsoring company and participating employers and are invested with an insurance company. The company is unable to identify its share of the underlying assets and liabilities of the scheme as a significant number of members who are deferred or pensioners within the scheme relate to businesses that are no longer part of the group. The Scheme was closed to new entrants from 1 April 2000. The contributions made by the Group over the financial year to this Scheme have been £64,132 (2009 - £62,540), equivalent to 18.4% of pensionable pay. As part of the information disclosed under FRS17 in the ultimate holding company's accounts, a net deficit of £10,020,000 (2009 - £12,806,000) is noted.

The Group also participates in various defined contribution schemes for their employees. The contributions made by the Group over the financial year to such schemes have been £1,160,868 (2009 - £836,460). Outstanding contributions at the balance sheet date to all pension arrangements amounted to £Nil (2009 - £Nil)
