Notes to the financial statements Year ended 31 December 2014

1. Accounting policies

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention and are in accordance with United Kingdom Accounting Standards. The following principal accounting policies have been applied:

Basis of preparation

The company has net liabilities of £1,845,000 (2013: £1,845,000). The ultimate parent company has confirmed that it will continue to support the company to enable it to meet its liabilities as they fall due and that it will not demand repayment of loan balances within twelve months from the date of approval of these financial statements. Accordingly the financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis.

Consolidated financial statements

The company is exempt under Section 400 of the Companies Act 2006 from the requirement to prepare consolidated financial statements as it and its subsidiary undertakings are included by full consolidation in the consolidated financial statements of its parent. These financial statements therefore present information about the company as an individual undertaking and not about its group.

Taxation

Current tax, including UK corporation tax and foreign tax, is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.

Investments

Investments are stated at cost less provision for impairment.

Cash flow statement

Under Financial Reporting Standard 1 'Cash Flow Statements' (FRS 1), the company is exempt from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement on the grounds that at least 90% of the voting rights in the company are controlled within the group headed by Caparo Group Limited and the company is included in the consolidated financial statements of Caparo Group Limited, which are publicly available. Consequently, the company has taken advantage of the exemption from preparing a cash flow statement under the terms of FRS 1.

2. Employees

The company does not employ any personnel. The activities of the company are managed by employees of a fellow subsidiary company of Caparo Group Limited, the ultimate parent company.

3. Directors' remuneration

No director received any remuneration during the current or prior year in relation to services provided to this company. The directors are remunerated by fellow subsidiary companies of Caparo Group Limited, the ultimate parent company.

4. Operating profit

No significant operating charges/(credits) were incurred during the current or previous year. The credit in the previous year related to income received from SKA Films. No audit fee or non-audit fee was borne by this company in either period, these fees were borne by fellow subsidiary companies of Caparo Group Limited, the ultimate parent company, and not recharged.
