1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(a) Accounting convention

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

(b) Capitalised interest

Interest is capitalised on specific and identifiable borrowings taken to finance buildings contracts or development work. The interest cost is amortised in line with the income generated by the project.

2 TURNOVER

Turnover is recognised in accordance with the stage of completion of contracts and excludes VAT.

3 AUDITORS' REMUNERATION

The operating loss is stated after charging auditors' remuneration of £816 (1995: £800).

4 COVENANT TO OUNDLE SCHOOL AND TAXATION

The company has covenanted to pay its profits liable to corporation tax subject to the availability of sufficient distributable reserves. No covenant was paid for 1995/96 due to the deficit on reserves.

There was no corporation tax charge in the year and taxable losses will be carried forward.
