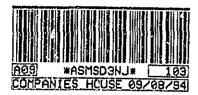

DIRECTORS' REPORT

The directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements for the year ended 31 December 1993.

ACTIVITIES

The group is principally engaged in the arranging of inclusive tour holidays in the long haul market and European ski market.

RESULTS FOR THE YEAR AND TRANSFERS FROM RESERVES

The profit for the financial year, as shown in the profit and loss account, amounted to £592,000 (1992 - £1,220,000). An interim dividend of £300,000 (1992 - £1,260,000) has been paid and the directors recommend payment of a final dividend of £500,000 (1992 - £300,000). The retained loss for the financial year of £208,000 (1992 - loss of £340,000) has been transferred from reserves.

REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENTS AND FUTURE PROSPECTS

The directors are confident that the group is well placed to take advantage of future market opportunities.

DIRECTORS

The present membership of the Board is set out on page 1. In addition G G Zwick (USA) served throughout the year until his resignation on 29 September 1993.

None of the directors had any interests in the share capital of the company or in any other group company incorporated in the United Kingdom.

FIXED ASSETS

The movements in fixed assets during the year are set out in notes 11 and 12 to the accounts.

DISABLED PERSONS

It is the policy of the group to give full and fair consideration to suitable applications for employment by disabled persons. Opportunities also exist for employees who become disabled to continue in their employment where feasible, or to be trained for other positions within the company. The company does not discriminate against disabled persons in respect of the selection of employees for promotion and career development, although account is taken of the suitability of candidates for the positions available.

EMPLOYEE INVOLVEMENT

During the year the company involved employees in the management of the business. This was carried out, in particular, by giving regular briefings to managers on financial performance, future plans and other issues of importance.



DIRECTORS' REPORT

DONATIONS

During the year the group made donations for charitable purposes of £m1 (1992 - £150).

AUDITORS

Touche Ross & Co. have expressed their willingness to continue in office as auditors and a resolution to reappoint them will be proposed at the forthcoming Annual General Meeting.

As described on page 4 the Company's directors are responsible for the preparation of financial statements. It is our responsibility to form an independent opinion, based on our audit, on those statements and to report our opinion to you.

Basis of opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the directors in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Company's and the Group's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with applicable accounting standards. The particular accounting policies adopted are described below.

Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention.

Basis of consolidation

The group's financial statements consolidate the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 1993 of the parent company and all subsidiaries. Goodwill arising on consolidation is written off directly to reserves.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided on cost in equal annual instalments over the estimated useful lives of the assets. The rates of depreciation are as follows:

Short-term leasehold improvements

Lesser of unexpired term of lease or expected

life of leasehold buildings and fittings

Plant and fixtures

Between 3 and 10 years

Investments

Shares in group companies are stated at cost less any provision for permanent diminution in value.

Stocks

Stocks are stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided on timing differences, arising from the different treatment of items for accounts and taxation purposes, which are expected to reverse in the future, calculated at rates at which it is estimated that tax will arise.

Foreign exchange

Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are translated into sterling at average rates. Amounts receivable and payable in foreign currencies at the balance sheet date are translated at the rates ruling at that date. Translation differences are dealt with in the profit and loss account.

Pension costs

The expected costs of providing pensions, as calculated periodically by professionally qualified actuaries, is charged to the profit and loss account so as to spread the cost over the service lives of employees in the scheme in such a way that the pension cost is a substantially level percentage of current and expected future pensionable payroll.

Forward seasons expenditure

Expenditure on marketing costs relating to future seasons is carried forward as part of prepayments and charged against the revenue of the relevant season.

Leases

Rental costs under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account in equal annual instalments over the period of the lease.



2. TURNOVER

Turnover represents the gross value of flights and holidays which have departed in the accounting period.

In the opinion of the directors, provision of additional segmental information as required by Statement of Standard Accounting Practice No.25 would be seriously prejudicial to the interests of the group. The information has therefore not been disclosed as permitted by Paragraph 55(5) of Schedule 4 to the Companies Act 1985.

3. ACQUISITIONS AND GOODWILL

100% of the issued share capital of Jetsave Limited and Greyhound Forld Travel Limited were acquired from the ultimate parent company on 23 April 1993 in exchange for the issue of 191,800 £1 ordinary shares. The acquisition reserve arising as a result of these acquisitions amounted to £1,554,465. The profit after taxation of Greyhound World Travel Limited for the year ended 31 December 1992 amounted to £349,459. Jetsave Limited had not traded for a number of years.

100% of the issued share capital of Jetsave Transatlantic Limited was acquired from the ultimate parent company on 23 April 1993 for a total consideration of £1. The goodwill arising as a result of the acquisition amounted to £59,782 and has been written off directly to reserves. Jetsave Transatlantic Limited had not traded for a number of years.

There were no adjustments made to the book value of the assets and liabilities acquired. The cash flow effects of the acquisitions are given in note 24.

28. ULTIMATE PARENT COMPANY

The company's ultimate parent company is The Dial Corp., incorporated in the United States of America. Copies of the group financial statements are available from The Dial Corp., Dial Tower, Phoenix, Arizona 85077.

29. PENSION SCHEME

The group operates a defined benefit pension scheme for all qualified employees. The assets of the scheme are held in separate trustee administered funds. The scheme is subject to triennial valuation by independent actuaries, the last valuation being carried out as at 6 April 1993, using the projected unit method, in which the actuarial liability makes allowances for projected earnings. The following actuarial assumptions were applied:

Investment returns 9% per annum Salary growth 7% per annum

At the last actuarial valuation date, the market value of the assets of the scheme was £990,986 and this actuarial value was sufficient to cover 101% of the benefits which had accrued to members, after allowing for expected future increases in earnings. The employer's contribution rate over the average remaining service lives of the members of the scheme takes account of the surplus disclosed by the valuation.
