Directors' Report for the year ended 31 August 2019

The directors present their annual report and the audited financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 August 2019. This Directors' Report has been prepared in accordance with the provisions applicable to small companies entitled to the small companies' exemption.

Principal activities

The principal activities of the company are property development, management and rental.

Results for the year and future prospects

The company's trading results are set out in the profit and loss account on page 7. The profit for the year before gift aid and taxation was £616,356 (2018: loss of £177,033).

During the year, the company completed the Development Funding Agreement which was to facilitate the development by a third party of two retail units and a profit of £890,126 was received.

Directors

The current directors who served throughout the financial year and up to the date of this report are as shown on page 1.

Going concern

The company had closing net assets of £430,535 (2018: net liabilities £185,821). The directors have a reasonable expectation that the company has adequate resources to continue in operational existence for the foreseeable future. No material uncertainties in relation to the ability of the company to continue on a going concern basis have been identified by the directors. Thus, they continue to adopt the going concern basis of accounting in preparing the financial statements.

Directors' responsibilities statement

The directors are responsible for preparing the Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the directors have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). Under company law the directors must not approve the financial statements unless they are satisfied that they give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period.

In preparing these financial statements, the directors are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- make judgements and accounting estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable UK Accounting Standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the Company will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping adequate accounting records that are sufficient to show and explain the Company's transactions and disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 2006. are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Independent Auditor's Report to the Members of Rowns moss Limited

Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Rowns moss Limited for the year ended 31 August 2019 which comprise the Profit and Loss Account, the Balance Sheet and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards, including Financial Reporting Standard 102 The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).



Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 August 2019

1 Company information

Rowns moss Limited is a private company limited by shares and registered in England and Wales (company number 01185176). The address of the registered office is Eton College, Eton, Windsor, Berkshire SL4 6DB.

2 Accounting policies

Basis of preparation of financial statements

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable United Kingdom accounting standards, including Financial Reporting Standard 102 ('FRS 102') Section 1A Small Entities, and with the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of investment properties at fair value through profit and loss.

Going concern

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis. The directors' considerations in relation to going concern are included in the Directors' Report.

Turnover

Turnover represents the proceeds, excluding VAT where applicable, from rental income and property development.

Investment properties

Independent valuers valued leasehold investment properties at 31 August 2018 and 31 August 2019. The aggregate surplus or deficit is transferred to unrealised gains and losses and shown on the profit and loss account. These properties are not depreciated.

Debtors

Debtors are recognised at the settlement date and measured at the transaction value.

Creditors

Trade creditors are measured at the transaction value as per the invoice. Other liabilities such as amount due to parent undertaking and other creditors are measured at transaction value.

Financial Instruments

Rowns moss Limited has financial assets and financial liabilities of a kind that qualify as basic financial instruments. Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at transaction value and subsequently measured at amortised cost. Financial assets held at amortised cost comprise cash at bank and in hand and trade debtors. Financial liabilities held at amortised cost comprise inter-company balances.

Taxation

Current tax is provided at amounts expected to be paid (or recovered) using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the balance sheet date.

Deferred taxation is provided in full on timing differences that result in an obligation at the balance sheet date to pay more tax, or a right to pay less tax, at a future date, at rates expected to apply when they crystallise based on current tax rates and law. Timing differences arise from the inclusion of items of income and expenditure in taxation computations in periods different from those in which they are included in the financial statements.

Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is regarded as more likely than not that they will be recovered. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are not discounted.

3 Turnover

The company's activities consist of property development, management and rental in the United Kingdom. Turnover arising from property development represents the proportion of work performed on long term contracts based on costs incurred to date. Turnover relating to rental income is recognised in the period to which it relates.

Rowns moss Limited recognises ground rent income of £3,528 (2018: £7,500). Rent income of £11,822 (2018: £28,073) and profit of £890,126 from the Development Funding Agreement. Total turnover of £905,544 is recognised in the financial statements.
