Introduction

The directors present their Strategic Report for the year ended 30 September 2020.

Business review

The principal activities of Logica International Limited (the "Company") is that of a company acting as a vehicle for both internal lending and deposit-taking with fellow group undertakings within the group headed by CGI Inc. (the "Group").

Logica International Limited is incorporated, domiciled and registered in the United Kingdom under the Companies Act 2006 and is a limited company. The Company's ultimate parent undertaking and controlling party is CGI Inc (the "Group").

Principal risks and uncertainties

The management of the business and the execution of the Company's strategy are subject to a number of risks. From the perspective of the Company, the principal risks and uncertainties are integrated with the principal risks of the group headed by CGI Inc. and are not managed separately.

The principal financial risk that the Company is exposed to is foreign currency exchange rate risk. The Company's policy with respect to managing the risk in both the current and prior year is set out below.

Foreign exchange risk

The foreign exchange risk associated with the loans to and from group undertakings is monitored centrally by the CGI Inc. treasury team and any significant exposures are hedged externally on a group aggregated basis.

Credit risk

The credit risk associated to the loans is considered to be minimal as the counter parties are all within a common group which is supported by CGI Inc., the ultimate parent company.

Interest rate risk

The loans to other group undertakings are interest bearing and are based on a fixed rate. The risk is monitored centrally by the CGI Inc. Treasury function.

Financial key performance indicators

The Company has a net asset position of £1,497,000 as of the balance sheet date (2019: £21,172,000). The Company also made a profit of £1,325,000 for the current year (2019: loss of £284,000).

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2020

1. Authorisation of financial statements and statement of compliance with FRS 101

The financial statements on pages 7 to 19 were approved by the board of directors on 11 June 2021 and the balance sheet was signed on the board's behalf by Darryl Eades. Entity Logica International Limited is a private company limited by shares, incorporated and domiciled in the United Kingdom.

These financial statements were prepared in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 101 Reduced Disclosure Framework (FRS 101) and in accordance with applicable accounting standards.

The Company's financial statements are presented in Sterling and all values are rounded to the nearest thousand pounds (£000) except when otherwise indicated.

The Company has taken advantage of the exemption under s401 of the Companies Act 2006 not to prepare group accounts as it is a wholly owned subsidiary of CGI Inc., a listed company incorporated in Canada.

The principal accounting policies adopted by the Company are set out in note 2.

2. Accounting policies

2.1 Basis of preparation of financial statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention unless otherwise specified within these accounting policies and in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard 101 'Reduced Disclosure Framework' and the Companies Act 2006.

2.2 Financial reporting standard 101 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The Company has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemptions under FRS 101:

- the requirements of IFRS 7 Financial Instruments: Disclosures
- the requirements of paragraphs 91-99 of IFRS 13 Fair Value Measurement

2.3 Going concern

2.4 Impact of new international reporting standards, amendments and interpretations

IFRS 16

From 1 October 2019, the Company has applied IFRS 16 using the modified retrospective method.

There have been no material impacts on the Company's financial statements as a result of adopting IFRS 16 from 1 October 2019.

2.5 Interest income

Interest income is recognised in the Income statement using the effective interest method.

2.6 Taxation

Tax is recognised in the Income statement, except that a charge attributable to an item of income and expense recognised as other comprehensive income or to an item recognised directly in equity is also recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity respectively.

The current income tax charge is calculated on the basis of tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the reporting date in the countries where the Company operates and generates income.

2.7 Debtors

Short term debtors are measured at transaction price, less any impairment. Loans receivable are measured initially at fair value, net of transaction costs, and are measured subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less any impairment.

2.8 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash is represented by cash in hand and deposits with financial institutions repayable without penalty on notice of not more than 24 hours. Cash equivalents are highly liquid investments that mature in no more than three months from the date of acquisition and that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash with insignificant risk of change in value.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2020

2. Accounting policies (continued)

2.9 Financial instruments

The Company recognises financial instruments when it becomes a party to the contractual arrangements of the instrument. Financial instruments are de-recognised when they are discharged or when the contractual terms expire. The Company's accounting policies in respect of financial instruments transactions are explained below:

Financial assets and financial liabilities are initially measured at fair value.

Financial assets

All recognised financial assets are subsequently measured in their entirety at either fair value or amortised cost, depending on the classification of the financial assets.

Fair value through profit or loss

All of the Company's financial assets are subsequently measured at fair value at the end of each reporting period, with any fair value gains or losses being recognised in profit or loss to the extent they are not part of a designated hedging relationship. The net gain or loss recognised in profit or loss includes any dividend or interest earned on the financial asset.

Impairment of financial assets

The Company always recognises lifetime 'Expected Credit Loss' ('ECL') for trade receivables and amounts due on contracts with customers. The expected credit losses on these financial assets are estimated based on the Company's historical credit loss experience, adjusted for factors that are specific to the debtors, general economic conditions and an assessment of both the current as well as the forecast direction of conditions at the reporting date, including time value of money where appropriate. Lifetime ECL represents the expected credit losses that will result from all possible default events over the expected life of a financial instrument.

Debt instruments at amortised cost

Debt instruments are subsequently measured at amortised cost where they are financial assets held within a business model whose objective is to hold financial assets in order to collect contractual cash flows and selling the financial assets, and the contractual terms of the financial asset give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding. Amortised cost is calculated using the effective interest method and represents the amount measured at initial recognition less repayments of principal plus the cumulative amortisation using the effective interest method of any difference between the initial amount and the maturity amount, adjusted for any loss allowance.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2020

2. Accounting policies (continued)

Financial liabilities

At amortised cost

Financial liabilities which are neither contingent consideration of an acquirer in a business combination, held for trading, nor designated as at fair value through profit or loss are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. This is a method of calculating the amortised cost of a financial liability and of allocating interest expense over the relevant period. The effective interest rate is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash payments through the expected life of the financial liability, or where appropriate a shorter period, to the amortised cost of a financial liability.

2.10 Foreign currencies

In preparing the financial statements, transactions in currencies other than the functional currency are recorded at the rates of exchange prevailing on the dates of the transactions. At each reporting date, the monetary assets and liabilities that are denominated in foreign currencies are retranslated at rates prevailing at each reporting date. Non-monetary assets and liabilities carried at fair value that are denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the rates prevailing at the date when the fair value was determined. Non-monetary items that are measured in terms of historical cost in a foreign currency are not retranslated.

2.11 Dividends

Equity dividends are recognised when they become legally payable. Interim equity dividends are recognised when paid. Final equity dividends are recognised when approved by the shareholders at an annual general meeting.

3. Judgments in applying accounting policies and key sources of estimation uncertainty

The Company makes estimates and assumptions concerning the future. The resulting accounting estimates will, by definition, seldom equal the related actual results. Management do not expect that any changes in the assumptions in the 12 months after balance sheet date would result in a material adjustment.

COVID-19 pandemic:

For the year ended September 30, 2020, the Company assessed the impact of the uncertainties around the outbreak of the novel strain of the coronavirus, specifically identified as COVID-19 pandemic, on its balance sheet carrying amounts. This review required the use of judgements and estimates and resulted in no material adjustments. The future impact of COVID-19 uncertainties could generate, in future reporting periods, a significant risk of material adjustments to the carrying value of receivables.

4. Auditors' remuneration

Audit fees for statutory audit services of £4,000 (2018: £5,000) were borne and paid for by another company within the Group and have not been allocated to the Company during the current and prior year.

5. Employees and Directors' remuneration

The Company has no employees (2019: nil) other than the directors. Emoluments for the directors of the Company were paid by other companies within the Group and have not been allocated to the Company during the year or prior years. The directors also provided services to other group undertakings and received remuneration from fellow group undertakings, CGI IT UK Limited and CGI Inc., in respect of services to the Group. It is not possible to identify the proportion of this remuneration that related to services provided to the Company.
