# 2 STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

# **LEGAL STATUS**

The charity is a company limited by guarantee and is governed by its memorandum and articles of association. The guarantee of individual members is limited to £1.00.

## APPOINTMENT, INDUCTION AND TRAINING OF TRUSTEES

**Board Appointment and Induction**: The Trustees/Directors are committed to reflecting the communities and interests of the groups with which the company works, as well as reflecting the fields relevant to company operations such as the arts, finance, legal, local government and PR. The membership of the Board is regularly reviewed to ensure that members reflect the skills and expertise deemed necessary.

Recruitment: Spare Tyre is a member of Arts and Business Board Bank and has had regular referrals from the Board Bank. Spare Tyre is a member of the Independent Theatre Council (ITC) and participates in ITC's GAIN board development scheme designed to increase the diversity of arts, heritage and sports organisations in London, at board level. When recruiting Trustees/Directors advertisements are placed with ITC and Arts and Business as well as on the company website. Exparticipants and related individuals are also approached and encouraged to join the Board as and when the need arises.

Induction/Appointment: When a potential Trustee/Director registers interest the Board are informed, an informal meeting is arranged with the Artistic Director/CEO and General Manager. At this meeting they are informed of the commitment, the number of meetings, other members of the Board, the company's current and future plans. The potential Trustee/Director is encouraged to attend a show and is given literature and DVDs to better understand the nature of Spare Tyre and its business. This meeting is followed up several days later by a phone call/email to establish continued interest from both parties. If interest is mutual their CV is distributed to the Board and they are invited to attend the next Board meeting as an observer. Again all parties are given time to consider skill, need and interest. If the answer is positive the potential Trustee/Director is invited to the next meeting where they are formally appointed. They are given all company documentation to help them be an informed and active member of the Board.

**Training**: Spare Tyre recognises that an important part of developing a skilled and effective Board is offering members suitable training. Spare Tyre is committed to providing all Trustees/Directors with the opportunity to attend training that would enhance individual knowledge of working effectively as a Trustee/Director. The Board receives regular updates and details of relevant training.

Organisation: The Board administers the charity and meet on a quarterly basis to discuss and ratify strategy as well as review ongoing matters. During the course of the year, day-to-day operational matters are delegated to 3 full time paid staff members — The Artistic Director/CEO, the General Manager and the Administrator. The Board receive and review reports from staff including management accounts, policy papers and new opportunities. The Board may form sub-committees as and when necessary to undertake specific duties of the Board such as personnel or finance.



#### RISK MANAGEMENT

The Trustees/Directors identify the major risks to which the charity is exposed each financial year when preparing and updating a strategic plan, in particular those related to the operations and finances of the charity. The Trustees/Directors then review any major risks, which have been identified, and establish systems to mitigate those risks. The charity is satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate their exposure to the major risks, which have been so identified and reviewed.

# 3 OBJECTIVES, ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

## **MISSION**

Spare Tyre uses theatre with voiceless communities to provide opportunities for people's life stories to be shared and celebrated creating theatre that transforms lives and challenges social prejudice.

#### **OBJECTIVES**

- To create high quality theatre productions with non-professional performers through a structured and supportive process where people's experiences can be explored and validated
- To offer training, support, mentoring matching people's ambitions.
- To involve agencies in partnerships that will ensure the necessary support for our work
- To respond to the changing needs of communities and also create models of good practice
- To assert Spare Tyre's image as a pioneering, provocative and innovative theatre company.

#### THE COMPANY

Spare Tyre began in 1979 with a group of women who wrote and performed a musical play about their personal experiences of body image. This technique of focussing on the personal to illustrate a wider political point became the Spare Tyre trademark. Over the intervening thirty years Spare Tyre has worked with many vulnerable communities, e.g. women, young gay men and women, homeless people, and producing challenging theatre from personal stories and helping to improve their quality of life and wellbeing.

Spare Tyre is a stable and thriving arts organisation owing its stability to good management and practice. Spare Tyre is revenue funded by Arts Council England (London), London Councils and the London Borough of Camden. It has healthy long-term relationships with several trusts, partners and peer organisations.

During 08/09 Spare Tyre focussed on 2 areas of activity:

- Elders Theatre Community: creative work with elders 60+
- · inc.Theatre: creative work with adults with learning disabilities 18+

Spare Tyre works intensively with people who have a wide range of disabilities such as dementia, autism, physical and sensory impairments, mental health, downs syndrome, and seizures.

Spare Tyre supports two ensembles **HotPots** (elders 60+) and **inc.Theatre Ensemble** (adults with learning disabilities) which are recognised Spare Tyre brands.

The company actively trains, manages and mentors artistic and administrative volunteers and placements. The company is committed to offering training for its freelance staff and paid employment to volunteers/placements.



## **ACTIVITIES**

# **Elders Theatre Community (ETC)**

ETC taps the talents of older people (60+) who suffer prejudice, misunderstanding and isolation. ETC makes links with the older community in a number of ways: weekly workshops in resource centres, bespoke training for healthcare professionals and the HOTPOTS who are a Camden based ensemble of skilled performers aged 60+ keen to tackle issues around old age and isolation positively, radically and inventively.

<u>Shows:</u> Angina Monologues, written by HotPots John Northeast, told the story of the music hall era, strained relationships, bad acts and decreasing audiences. The 12 HotPots worked under Director Arti Prashar for the first time, developing new performance skills and working as an ensemble. The creative team were Tayo Akinbode, Carolene Hinds, Ann Cross, Rajha Shakiry, Dan Moriyama, Crin Claxton, Steve Vearncombe and Roeland Muller.

"The productions affirm the experiences of the members. People are heard and taken seriously. Their life experiences are what is performed. Working relationships are collaborative/cooperative rather than subject/object where a director might dictate to the cast."

<u>Partnerships and Outreach:</u> Spare Tyre developed working partnerships with The Sundial Centre, The Peabody Trust, Islington Social Services, Camden PCT and Interchange Trust:

**Steaming Pot:** A challenging outreach project in 4 centres in the Borough of Tower Hamlets, a short sharp project, affording limited contact time with participants. Participants came from diverse cultural backgrounds: Jewish, Muslim, cockney east end and the Caribbean. **Steaming Pot** produced a live performance, sound and film/animation. The artist team were Danielle Krepka, Julia Schauerman, Carolene Hinds, Nicola Schauerman and Arti Prashar.

MDT: Patient Discharge training for healthcare workers delivered by members of the HotPots.

Alsen: Weekly workshops focussing on storytelling, drama and performance skills at Alsen day centre produced a moving version of *The Nightingale* recorded as a CD. The artist team were Julia Schauerman, Rosie Emanuel, Ann Cross, Abigail Schischa.

*HotPots:* Research and development and weekly workshops building theatre skills for the summer 2009 show *Feeble Minds* led by Isaac Ngugi and Arti Prashar.



# inc.Theatre

inc. Theatre encourages skilled artists with learning disabilities to tackle issues surrounding identity and social cohesion, engaging with the wider arts community through the inc. Theatre Ensemble, weekly workshops and outreach work.

<u>Shows</u>: The inc.Theatre Ensemble devised and performed DARK INC a show based on personal experiences tackling profound themes of love, jealousy, violence, loneliness and madness, in a cold ugly modern world. DARK INC energised, frightened and made you laugh all at the same time, putting mental health on the agenda in an accessible way, a milestone show for Spare Tyre. It was an extremely funny moving piece of live art performance. Jesus Gamon's lighting enhanced designer Jo Paul's shadowy set and fantastic costumes, whilst Julia Schauerman's sound added a powerful eerie and comic quality to the piece under Arti Prashar's direction.

By touring to arts venues **DARK INC** reached a non-disabled audience and introduced learning disabled audiences to theatre and arts venues. Touring to Watermans Arts Centre and the Millennium Centre in Cardiff Spare Tyre gained real insight into what support would have to be put in place to tour nationally with vulnerable adults.

The **DARK INC** tour succeeded in building relationships with arts venues, building new audiences, developing accessible A4 publicity material, and engaging London Disability Arts Forum magazine and *Guardian Society* in Learning Disabled theatre.

A Touch of Inc was an adapted version of DARK INC for the Beautiful Octopus Club at the Albany in Deptford. DARK INC characters interacted with clubbers and drew an audience into a room to watch performance art pieces.

<u>Go inc to Work</u> is an assisted employment scheme funded by City Parochial Foundation, enabling artists with learning disabilities to have a realistic approach to the Arts industry and prepare themselves for work by developing more then one skill, understanding their finances and making their own choices about their futures in the arts. The backbone of this scheme is its highly skilled and committed Co-ordinator, Artistic Mentors, Advocate, Support Workers and Volunteers. The team includes Claire Taylor, Pete Lawson, Issac Ngugi, Maria da Luz Ghoumrassi, Gavin Dent, Fay Hennel, Heba Soliman, Mark Waddell.

"There are early indications of positive soft outcomes in terms of trainees improving their technical and social skills and building their self-confidence as well as some indications that trainees have seen their interest in finding paid work strengthened or rekindled. Their feedback about the project is overwhelmingly positive and the evaluation team struggled to get individuals to suggest areas for improvement...It was particularly appreciated that the Go inc. To Work project is [long] term — "slow, little increments seem to work best with this group of individuals"."

<u>Partnerships and Outreach</u>: Spare Tyre developed working partnerships with Charlton School, Watermans Arts Centre, Redbridge Youth Service and Redbridge College:



Spare Tyre ran two arts projects using music, video, dance and design for 12 weeks each for Watermans Arts Centre. Both projects produced a showcase led by artists Julia Schauerman, Carolene Hinds and Rajha Shakiry. The first was based on music **Mood an' Rhythm** and the second **Bags of Fun** on fashion.

Step On Step Off: was a residency over two weeks at Charlton Special School in Greenwich during February 2009. The residency involved 4 inc. Theatre Ensemble members employed as workshop leaders, 2 Spare Tyre artists, 11 young people and 6 school staff. Step On Step Off was an exploration of change as experienced by the school leavers. Participants explored issues around hopes and dreams, relationships, what next? Support staff received a training workshop introducing Spare Tyre's way of working prior to the residency. The training and the residency itself produced thought provoking dialogue with staff as to how to manage change and expectation for young adults who have been so highly institutionalised, who have never used public transport or travelled without support.

"Students worked well with each other, Spare Tyre visitors and inc.Theatre Ensemble performer. Relationships were formed in the short space of time. Really great to see connections between the adults and students with learning disabilities with the inc.Theatre performers helping and guiding the Charlton students."

The residency produced photos, a soundscape, artwork, design and a performance. Characters were created and performed by Charlton School pupils. The performance took place at the school to an audience of 75 students, parents and staff. As a result of this challenging residency Spare Tyre are now in discussion with Charlton School to run weekly workshops at the school.

### inc.Theatre Courses:

Spare Tyre has developed and delivered three accreddited theatre skills courses for adults with learning disabilities: a two year Level 1 OCN course, a 20-week accredited short course (Entry Level OCN), and an Entry Level Edexel theatre skills course. Professional artists led these courses, inspiring 33 students to achieve achieve creative and life skills. The creative team included Claire Taylor, Danielle Krepka, Nicola Schauerman, Ian Teague, Gavin Dent, Anne Murray, Lucy Meah, Cynthia Bowling, Antony Howell.

#### ACHIEVEMENTS AND PERFORMANCE

- Produced pioneering, provocative and innovative theatre.
- Raised the company's profile and reputation, enabling older people and adults with learning disabilities to have a voice by being seen as artists in their own right.
- Produced high quality inclusive multi art form workshops throughout the year.
- Developed and delivered:
  - a new Edexcel accredited entry level inc. Theatre course
  - forum based training workshops for health care professionals
  - 2 new London-wide touring theatre productions (DARK INC and Angina Monologues)
  - DARK INC performed at disability arts festival Unity, Wales Millenium Centre
  - Steaming Pot a project for older peoples centres, producing a DVD for dissemination
- Developed, user tested and launched newly accessible www.sparetyre.org



- Enabled visibility of artists with learning disabilities through the DARK INC tour, developing high quality accessible A4 publicity, making new partnerships with venues, introducing new audiences to venues and venues to audiences.
- Rigorously trained the HotPots to better their performance skills and work as an ensemble.
- Nurtured and progressed two young community practitioners Danielle Krepka and Claire
  Taylor who at the heart of their practice have embraced Spare Tyre's working methods.
- Trained and continue to mentor Helen George from the ITC Fast Track Disability scheme.
- Look at Me a documentary of our 3 year long elders project: Seniors Confronting Alienation through Theatre (SCAT) was screened on the Community Channel.
- Spare Tyre's positive profile has enabled dialogue with new artists and organisations widening our pool of arts practitioners.
- Reached the company's reserve target for the year-end.

# 4 PLANS FOR FUTURE PERIODS

Below are priority areas for Spare Tyre for 2009/10 – 2012/13:

- To co-produce a show for young people with a theatre company that specialises in young peoples theatre, employing inc. Theatre Ensemble artists.
- To share Spare Tyre's inclusive theatre practice beyond London and the UK.
- To research and develop a show for audiences with complex disabilities and dementia, working with performers from HotPots and inc.Theatre Ensemble.
- To develop and promote Go inc To Work (assisted employment scheme for artists with learning disabilities) within the creative industries.
- To appoint a volunteer co-ordinator.
- To develop Spare Tyre's volunteer/placement scheme and offer bespoke intensive bursaries for 3/5 volunteers.
- To research, develop and forge links with organisations working with vulnerable women to produce verbatim readings and productions.
- To produce a community show that involves more than one community.
- To create a new 3 year strategic plan during 2009/10

# 5 FINANCIAL REVIEW

The detailed figures are included in the financial statements. The charity achieved a surplus of income over expenditure for the year of £27,803. Free reserves at 31<sup>st</sup> March 2009 were £61,793, with no restricted funds held.



#### INVESTMENT POLICY

The Trustees, having regard to the liquidity requirements of operating the company and to the reserves policy, have operated a policy of keeping available funds across two interest bearing deposit accounts.

## RESERVES POLICY

The Trustees have established the level of reserves (that is those funds that are freely available) to maintain adequate working capital. Reserves are needed to bridge the funding gaps between spending on projects and receiving resources through grants and fees that provide funding. The Trustees therefore consider that the ideal level of reserves as at 31<sup>st</sup> March 2009 would be approximately £50,000, being three months of running costs. The Trustees aim to build these reserves to meet the above target over the next five years.

# 6 TRUSTEES' RESPONSIBILITIES

Company law requires the Trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity at the end of the year and of the incoming and outgoing resources for the year then ended, and prepared in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice.

In preparing those financial statements, the Trustees are required to select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently, making judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent. The Trustees must also prepare the financial statements on an ongoing basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue its activities.

The Trustees are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the charity and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. The Trustees are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the charity and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

So far as the Trustees are aware, there is no relevant audit information of which the company's auditors are unaware, and each Trustee has taken all the steps that they ought to have taken to make themselves aware of any relevant audit information and to establish that the company's auditors are aware of that information.

# 7 AUDITORS

A resolution will be proposed at the Annual General Meeting that Jon Catty and Company be reappointed as auditors for the charity for the coming year.

# **Accounting Policies**

#### Historical Cost 1 a

The accounts are prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with accounting standards.

#### 1 b Compliance

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice for Charities (SORP 2005) issued in March 2005, applicable UK Accounting Standards and the Companies Act 1985.

#### 1 c Cash Flow Statement

As a Small Company, the Company is not required to prepare a Cash Flow Statement in accordance with FRS1 (revised).

#### 1 d Depreciation and Amortisation

Depreciation is provided at the following rates in order to write down the cost or valuation of all tangible assets, over their expected useful lives as follows:

Motor Vehicles:

12.5% straight line

Computer and Touring Equipment: 33% straight line

Office Equipment:

15% reducing balance

#### **Incoming Resources** 1 e

- Income from performance fees is included in incoming resources in the period in which i the relevant performance takes place.
- ii Grants for core activities are included in the year to which they relate.
- iii Grants from Trusts and Donors are recognised as income in the SOFA in the year in which they are received. Any such income that is received for projects to be undertaken in future periods is carried forward as a balance on Restricted Funds.
- iv The Income and Expenditure account recognises the income applicable to the year's activities.
- v Interest receivable is included when received by the Charity.

#### 1 f Resources Expended

Expenditure is recognised on the accruals basis. All costs which can be directly attributable to charitable activities are allocated thereto, including support costs and staff salaries.

It is not considered that any purpose would be served in apportioning support costs (ie, overheads, administration expenses and staff salaries) to particular charitable activities, and to do so would be arbitrary and could be misleading.

Governance costs include the expenses incurred in the governance of the Charity which do not relate to the provision of charitable activities, and are primarly associated with constitutional and statutory matters.

#### 1 g **Funds Structure**

The funds structure of the Charity is described in note 5.

#### 1 h Value added tax

As the majority of Spare Tyre Theatre Company's activities are classified as exempt or non-business activities for the purpose of VAT, the company is not registered and is therefore not able to reclaim VAT which it suffers on its costs. Expenditure in these financial statements is therefore shown inclusive of VAT.
