Basis of Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the Accounts. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the Directors in the preparation of the Accounts and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Company's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the Accounts are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. Departure from Accounting Standard

The Company's investment properties are included in the financial statements on the basis indicated in note 1(c) on accounting policies. This does not comply with the requirements of Statement of Standard Accounting Practice No.19 which requires such properties to be stated at their open market value.

Qualified Opinion Arising from Departure from Accounting Standard

Except for any adjustments that might have been necessary had they complied with the requirements of Statement of Standard Accounting Practice No.19, in our opinion the Accounts give a true and fair view of the state of the Company's affairs at 31st March 1995 and of its profit for the year then ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the provisions of the Companies Act 1985 applicable to small companies.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a) Accounting Convention

The Accounts are prepared under the Historical Cost Convention.

b) Depreciation

In accordance with Statement of Standard Accounting Practice No. 19, no depreciation is provided in respect of freehold investment properties. This departure from the requirements of the Companies Act 1985, for all properties to be depreciated, is necessary, as the directors consider that this accounting policy results in the financial statements giving a true and fair view.

c) Investment Properties

Investment properties are included in the balance sheet at historical cost, which is not in accordance with Statement of Standard Accounting Practice No.19.

d) Acquisition and Disposals of Properties

Acquisitions and disposals are considered to have taken place at the date of legal completion and are included in the financial statements accordingly.

e) Cash Flow Statement

The Company is exempted from the requirement to prepare a cash flow statement (in accordance with Financial Reporting Standard No.1) on the basis of its being a 'small company' as defined by Section 247 Companies Act 1985.
