Principal activities and business review

The Company runs private acute hospitals and residential nursing homes. Both the level of business and the year end financial position remain satisfactory, and the directors expect that the present level of activity will be sustained for the foreseeable future.

Financial results

The Group's results are shown in the profit and loss account on page 5. The directors propose a final dividend of £1,289,452 (1992 - final dividend of £233,957 and an interim dividend of £180,000). The retained loss of £721,840 (1992 - £nil) has been transferred to reserves.

Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December 1993

1 Accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards under the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of land and buildings, Accounts are made up to the nearest practicable Friday to 31 December each year.

Basis of consolidation

The consolidated financial statements presented incorporate the financial statements of the Holding Company and its subsidiaries. All companies within the Group prepare their financial statements to 31 December.

Financial Reporting Standard No3

The accounting standard, FRS3 requires the adoption of accounting policies which differ from those previously adopted by the Group. In previous years profits or losses on the sale of fixed assets carried at valuation have been included in the profit and loss account based on the difference between proceeds and depreciated historical cost. This policy has now been changed and such profits and losses are now included based on the difference between proceeds and net carrying amount, whether at valuation or depreciated historical cost.

Depreciation

Depreciation of fixed assets is provided where it is necessary to reflect a reduction from book value to its estimated residual value over the useful life of the asset to the Group. It is the group's policy to maintain its properties in a state of good repair and in the case of freehold properties, the directors consider that the lives of these properties and their residual values are such that their depreciation is not significant. Accordingly, no depreciation is provided on freehold properties.

Other fixed assets are written off by equal annual instalments over their anticipated useful lives of between three and sixteen years.

Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Deferred taxation

Deferred taxation is provided on the liability method in respect of all timing differences between profits as stated in the accounts and as computed for taxation purposes where, in the opinion of the directors, it is probable that the liability will crystallise in the foreseeable future.

Contributions to Pension Funds

Contributions to pension funds are determined on the basis of recommendations made by independent qualified actuaries, and are charged to profit and loss account in such a way as to provide for the liabilities evenly over the remaining working lives of employees.

Turnover

Turnover represents the aggregate of amounts receivable, net of any value added tax, for goods and services supplied.

Cash flow statement

The company is a wholly owned subsidiary of Nestor-BNA plc and the cash flows of the company are included in the consolidated group cash flow statement of Nestor-BNA plc. Consequently the company is exempt under the terms of Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from publishing a cash flow statement.

Operating leases

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the profit and loss account on a straight line basis over the term of the lease.

2 Turnover

Turnover arises from nursing home and hospital management. All turnover arises in the United Kingdom.

3 Exceptional administrative costs

These represent costs associated with the development of the business.

In addition to the potential liability shown above, a taxation charge of approximately £1m would arise on chargeable gains in the event of the Company's properties being realised at valuations at which they are included in the balance sheet at 31 December 1993.

18 Pension and similar obligations

Employees who are eligible for membership join the Nestor-BNA plc Retirement Benefits Scheme providing benefits based on final pensionable salary. The scheme is administered by Trustees separately from the affairs of the Group and is contracted out of the additional component of the State Pension Scheme.

R Watson & Sons, Consulting Actuaries, carried out an actuarial valuation of the scheme as at 30 April 1992. On the actuarial basis used, as at that date the assessed value of the assets was sufficient to cover the capitalised value of the accrued benefits, allowing for expected future increases in pensionable earnings to Normal Pension Age, treating the scheme as an on-going entity. Details of the actuarial assumptions are disclosed in the Financial statements of Nestor-BNA plc.

The employer's contribution rate, which was calculated using the projected unit method, remains at 6.2% of members' pensionable earnings. The members' contribution rate is 5% of pensionable earnings.

The pension charge for the year was £74,040 (1992 £73,683)
