#### Status

Community Arts North West Limited is a company Limited by guarantee and registered under the Companies Act 1985, registration number 1400213. It is a registered charity, charity number 277135.

#### Activities and objects

The company was established to improve the conditions of life in local communities in the North West of England by encouraging inhabitants to participate fully in a wide range of creative artistic activities with the assistance of the company acting in association with local authorities and voluntary groups.

#### Organisation

The charity is governed by its Council which consists of not less than two and not more than fifteen Trustee members.

The Council is responsible for formulating the strategy for the charity including the approval of budgets and the exercising of financial controls through regular financial reporting.

#### Directors' responsibilities

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the directors are required to:

- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and to enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

#### Review of development, activities and achievements

This year has been a year of change for CAN, with a fantastic array of work and new members of staff on board. Everyone has worked extremely hard.

In total, the company ran 325 sessions in Manchester, Greater Manchester and other parts of the region. We employed 51 free lance artists, worked with 1,501 participants, and presented work to audiences totalling 3,861.

Highlights of the year include the vibrant Youth Mehfill finale at the Contact, where many young Asian people form Manchester and Oldham came together to share and celebrate their work.

Broken Planet also represented a real development of our work with The Big Issue in the North. Naked Sub Culture devised and performed their new show - Broken Planet at Contact in Manchester, The Unity in Liverpool and the Merlin Theatre in Sheffield.

CAN still is able to offer free information and advice to community groups and individuals. In particular CAN is seen as an agency for artists and plays a key role in supporting artists into employment and futures either through our own programmes, access to training, support and development and/or referral to other organisations looking for artists

We are delighted to welcome the new chair of CAN - Sue Fletcher, but would like to join in with all the staff and management board to thank the retiring Mike Hood who has given tremendous service to this company. We are pleased that Mike has agreed to stay on the board as a director.

CAN's "earned income", non-revenue funding in 01/02 represented 52% of overall running costs. At the close of March 2002 CAN has managed to clear the accumulated deficit of £3,211.

CAN would like to thank all our funders, in particular Manchester City Council and North West Arts Board who continue to believe in supporting the arts of communities.

#### Risks

The directors have identified the risks that the charity may be exposed to in the next financial year and have established strategies to mitigate those risks.

#### Financial results and Reserves

Income has decreased to £188,096 (2001 - £209,809)

Expenditure has decreased to £177,952 (2001 - £226,579)

Net Incoming/(Outgoing) Resources for the year are £10,144 (2001 - £(16,770)

Unrestricted funds are £5,244 and the directors consider this level appropriate to the charity's current needs for the effective financial management of its activities at their present level.

#### Basis of opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with United Kingdom Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the trustees in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the charity's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

#### 1. Accounting policies

#### a) Basis of Preparation of Financial Statements

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective June 2002), the Companies Act 1985 and follow the recommendations in Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice issued in October 2000.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from the requirement to produce a cashflow statement on the grounds that it is a small company.

#### b) Tangible Fixed Assets and Depreciation

Tangible fixed sssets are stated at cost less depreciation.

Depreciation is provided to write off the cost less the estimated residual value of tangible fixed assets over their expected useful lives as follows.
