# **STATUS**

Community Arts North West Limited is a company Limited by guarantee and registered under the Companies Act 1985, registration number 1400213. It is a registered charity, charity number 277135.

### ACTIVITIES AND OBJECTS

The company was established to improve the conditions of life in local communities in the North West of England by encouraging inhabitants to participate fully in a wide range of creative artistic activities with the assistance of the company acting in association with local authorities and voluntary groups.

# **ORGANISATION**

The charity is governed by its Council which consists of not less than two and not more than fifteen Trustee members.

The Council is responsible for formulating the strategy for the charity including the approval of budgets and the exercising of financial controls through regular financial reporting.

# **DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES**

# REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENT, ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

1998/99 was a particular fruitful year in building alliances and partnership work with many other arts based agencies, particularly in Manchester. This has positive implications for the future in terms of the use of main stream resources for community arts based work, networking and the sharing of information. This year also saw considerable activity in preparation for major Millennium Festival submissions. We were pleased to learn that three of our major project proposals have been successful, totalling £72,500 over this and next year for cultural production work. We were also delighted to learn that our very first ESF application, for research into cultural industries employment patterns, had been successful.

We were seriously held back this year by the temporary loss of our Video Arts Development worker for a four month period, due to a road accident. This serves to remind the company of the tight financial margins that we operate within, particularly in a year where the company was putting into practise its new funding agreement with Manchester City Council.

The deficit for the year was caused by non-payment of a fee for a project taking place in the Northern Regeneration SRB area of Manchester; an issue which is still being pursued.

The deficit will be addressed with the projected surplus for 1999/2000.

Project highlights of the year included existing developments for two of our major sustainable development projects - 'The Longsight Youth Arts Projects' and 'The East Manchester Community Forum' - with a major award for a 2 year training through the 'History of Gospel' production project and a major festival for children and young people resident in East Manchester. Another highlight was the extremely successful video drama production of 'When John Met Kate' made by a group of young disabled people in Tameside. The video has had an enormous response locally and nationally and has been shortlisted for the 'Co-operative Young Film Makers Festival'.

CAN employed a total of 28 freelance artists and gave information, advice and support to over 300 people via telephone, correspondence or through face to face contact during the year.

# REVIEW OF AUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR

Income has decreased to £108,093 (1998 - £128,013). Expenditure has decreased to £114,788 (1998 - £122,438). Net Outgoing Resources for the year are £6,695 (1998 - Surplus £5,575)

# **AUDITORS**

The auditors, De La Wyche Travis & Co, will be proposed for re-appointment in accordance with Section 385 of the Companies Act 1985.

# Basis of opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amount and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the directors in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the company's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

# Going Concern

In forming our opinion we have considered the adequacy of the disclosures made in note 11 of the financial statements which refers to the net current liabilities of £5,046 shown on the balance sheet. As explained in the note the directors are satisfied that the company is a going concern.

We consider that these facts should be brought to your attention but our opinion is not qualified in this respect.

# Opinion

In our opinion the financial statements give a true and fair view of the Charitable Company's state of affairs at 31st March 1999, and of its incoming resources and application of resources, including its income and expenditure, in the year then ended and have been properly prepared in accordance with the Companies Act 1985.
