

REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS

YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 1998

STATUS

Community Arts North West Limited is a company Limited by guarantee and registered under the Companies Act 1985, registration number 1400213. It is a registered charity, charity number 277135.

ACTIVITIES AND OBJECTS

The company was established to improve the conditions of life in local communities in the North West of England by encouraging inhabitants to participate fully in a wide range of creative artistic activities with the assistance of the company acting in association with local authorities and voluntary groups.

ORGANISATION

The charity is governed by its Council which consists of not less than two and not more than fifteen Trustee members.

The Council is responsible for formulating the strategy for the charity including the approval of budgets and the exercising of financial controls through regular financial reporting.

DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS

YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 1998

REVIEW OF DEVELOPMENT, ACTIVITIES AND ACHIEVEMENTS

During 1997/98 CAN co-ordinated a steady stream of cultural, artistic and developmental work. The latter six months of the year were especially busy in terms of the number of projects completed. This programme was the fruit of development work which, in some cases, stretched back into the previous funding year and of the company's ability to respond to new proposals and initiatives.

The year ended on a high note with a very successful 20th birthday event which the company used as an effective marketing opportunity. Receipts for projects (monies additional to annual funding from NW Arts Board and Manchester City Council) increased three fold on 1996/97 levels to £43,000, or roughly one third of total company income. However, the continued standstill of annual funding levels - effectively a cut against inflation - and changes to the administration of the Council grant in 1998/99 offer new challenges to CAN.

On the personnel front, CAN's Artistic Director left the company in November 1997. The post was unfilled at the end of March 1998. CAN's management committee was strengthened by the appointment of several new directors during the latter part of the financial year.

REVIEW OF AUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR

Income has increased to £128,013 (1997 - £99,193). Expenditure has increased to £122,438 (1997 - £103,250). Net Incoming Resources for the year are £5,575 (1997 - DEFICIT £(4,057))

AUDITORS

The auditors, De La Wyche Travis & Co, will be proposed for re-appointment in accordance with Section 385 of the Companies Act 1985.
