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REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS

The directors submit their report and the audited financial statements of the company, which is registered in England, for the period 4 April 2008 to 31 December 2008.

DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITIES

The directors are responsible for preparing the Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and regulations.

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year. Under that law the directors have elected to prepare the financial statements in accordance with United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice (United Kingdom Accounting Standards and applicable law). The financial statements are required by law to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. In preparing those financial statements the directors are required to:

- Select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- Make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- Prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The directors confirm that they have complied with the above requirements in preparing the financial statements.

The directors are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the company and enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Companies Act 1985. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the company and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Having made the requisite enquiries, so far as the directors are aware, there is no relevant audit information (as defined by Section 234ZA of the Companies Act 1985) of which the company's auditors are unaware, and the directors have taken all the steps they ought to have taken to make themselves aware of any relevant audit information and to establish that the company's auditors are aware of this information.

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES

The principal activity of the company was the operation of garden centres. The company transferred its business during the period to a fellow subsidiary and the principal activity has changed to property holding.

FIXED ASSETS

Movements on intangible fixed assets and tangible fixed assets are set out in notes 6 and 7 respectively to the financial statements.

REPORT OF THE DIRECTORS

REVIEW OF BUSINESS AND FUTURE DEVELOPMENTS

As part of the restructuring and sale of the company, the trade and assets of one of the company's trading operations and the company's investment property were distributed as a dividend in specie. The entire share capital of the company was then purchased by MGCL Limited, a 100% subsidiary of Blue Diamond Limited. The company's other trading operations and assets, with the exception of the company's land and buildings were transferred to Blue Diamond UK Limited, a fellow subsidiary company, immediately upon acquisition. The company's main activity changed to property holding with effect from 4 April 2008 and the remaining land and buildings within the company were revalued at that date.

RESULTS AND DIVIDENDS

The results of the company for the period are set out in detail on page 5.

The directors report a dividend in specie of the trade and assets of one of the company's operations at a net book value of £1,323,774 declared on 4 April 2008. The directors do not recommend the payment of a final dividend.

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NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Convention

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention as modified by the revaluation of freehold land and buildings. The principal accounting policies which the directors have adopted within that convention are set out below.

Income

Turnover represented the total of sales income (net of value added tax) from the retailing of garden centre products.

Rental income was accounted for on an accruals basis.

Freehold land and buildings

The directors consider that the company's freehold buildings are maintained in such a state of repair that their residual value is at least equal to their net book value. As a result the corresponding depreciation charge would not be material and therefore is not charged in the profit and loss account. The directors perform annual impairment reviews in accordance with the requirements of Financial Reporting Standard No. 11 – Impairment of Fixed Assets and Goodwill and of Financial Reporting Standard No. 15 – Tangible Fixed Assets, to ensure that the carrying value of such assets is not lower than their recoverable amount.

Freehold investment property

In accordance with Statement of Standard Accounting Practice No. 19 the company's freehold investment property was carried at its open market value.

Stock

Stock, which comprised retail goods for resale, was stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value after making due provision for damaged, obsolete or slow moving items.

Goodwill

Goodwill represented the amount by which the purchase consideration for the acquisition of a business exceeded the fair value to the company of the separable net assets acquired. Goodwill was amortised to the profit and loss account over its estimated economic life. Amortisation was provided over a period of 15 years.

Deferred taxation

Deferred tax balances are recognised in respect of all timing differences that have originated but not reversed by the balance sheet date, except that the recognition of deferred tax assets is limited to the extent that the group anticipates making sufficient taxable profits in the future to absorb the reversal of the underlying timing differences.

Deferred tax balances are not discounted.

Going concern

The directors have prepared the financial statements on a going concern basis. The directors consider this to be appropriate as they have received assurances from the company's ultimate parent company to the effect that the ultimate parent company will continue to make funds available to the company for the foreseeable future and will continue to meet the company's obligations to other creditors as and when they fall due.

2. TURNOVER AND OPERATING PROFIT

Turnover and operating profit for the comparative period derived wholly from discontinued activities that were carried out exclusively in the United Kingdom and were wholly attributable to the principal activity of the company that was the operation of garden centres. The principal activity changed to property holding on 4 April 2008, and the operating profit for the current financial period derives exclusively from this activity, which is carried out in the United Kingdom.

From 4 April 2008 the parent company and controlling party, which has interests in 100% of the issued share capital of the company, is MGCL Limited, a company incorporated in England. The ultimate parent company from date of change in shareholders was Blue Diamond Limited, a company incorporated in Guernsey. The issued share capital of Blue Diamond Limited is owned by numerous parties and therefore, in the opinion of the directors, the ultimate controlling party is Blue Diamond Limited.

In the preparation of these financial statements the directors have taken advantage of the exemption under Financial Reporting Standard No. 8 - Related Party Disclosures and have not disclosed the details of related party transactions with entities that are part of the Blue Diamond Limited group or investees of that group.
