Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 December 2018

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2018. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies set out in the notes to the accounts and comply with the charity's governing document, the Charities Act 2011 and Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities published on 16 July 2014.

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The principal activities of the company in the year under review were those of charitable and religious activities.

The objects of the company are:

"To provide an open environment in which Christian faith and doctrine can be freely promulgated"

Mission Statement

The Ice House Christian Centre exists for the purpose of promoting all aspects of the Christian Faith through literature, evangelism, concert, teaching and celebration.

Public Benefit

The Trustees have referred to the guidance in the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit when reviewing the charity's aims and objectives and in planning future activities.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

The Trustees are pleased to report on another year of steady growth both in relation to the propagation of the Christian faith, and the wider outreach and service provided for the local community in North East Lincolnshire.

The Weekly Prayer Meetings continued to be led by Chris and Elizabeth Norman whilst the now twice Monthly Praise and Worship Evenings featured a variety of musical, visual and speaker led events. The Chinese Christian Church which covers the South Bank of the Humber, also continued to meet on a monthly basis, and other monthly gatherings included both the Baptists devotional and breakfast meetings and Wings (women in Gods service).

Turning to the charitable and community based activities, the Trustees were pleased to have as tenants and to support a number of very different service providers who include Grimsby and district Dial A Ride who's objective is to provide flexible, accessible transport for people who find it difficult to use public transport due to illness, disability or age. The latest report from Dial A Ride showed that they had delivered over 52,000 passenger journeys in the year, and travelled more than 240,000 miles in the process. In complete contrast the Ice House continued to house Community Art Works Limited (CAWL) which provides creative art classes particularly for those of a more modest background and many living in the adjacent and highly deprived East Marsh area of Grimsby.

A welcome newcomer to the portfolio of service providers was the Cats Protection Charity who hold their staff and volunteer meetings at Victor Street and on a monthly basis utilise the open reception area as a "surgery" at which to distribute veterinary vouchers for the neutering and chipping of the local cat population. At the time of writing this report in April 2019 they had distributed £20,000 worth of vouchers.

Finally it was pleasing to learn that the Trustees of the Matt 6.3 Charitable Trust had made the decision to move their administration and accounting service staff from Scunthorpe to Grimsby, where they were now happily installed in newly refurbished accommodation on the first floor of the Ice House building, which also continued to house the Samaritan Purse Operation, with their volunteers working and receiving donated goods throughout the year.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Reserves policy

The company's reserves are currently at a level to support more than one year's costs. The directors feel that this is adequate as the charity is well supported.

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a deed of trust, and constitutes a limited company, limited by guarantee, as defined by the Companies Act 2006.

Organisational structure and decision making process

The strategy of the company is determined by the trustees, who are also the directors. They meet on a regular basis and their discussions and decisions are minuted.

The day to day management of the Christian Centre is undertaken by Mark Harris who is supported by a small team of volunteers and paid staff.

Related parties

The company co-operates with various other charitable organisations (e.g. local churches etc) to achieve the company's objectives as mentioned within this report. Details of transactions undertaken with related parties can be found in the notes to the accounts.

Limited by Guarantee

The company is limited by guarantee (No 1434516) and does not have share capital. Each member undertakes to contribute £1 to the assets of the company in the event of it being wound up. The number of members at 31 December 2018 was 2 (2017 - 2). The company is also a registered charity No 509196.

1. STATUTORY INFORMATION

The Christian Centre (Humberside) Ltd is a charitable company incorporated in England within the UK. The address of the registered office and registered numbers are given on page 2.

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

The financial statements are prepared in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity and rounded to the nearest pound.

The company is a public benefit entity.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Donations are recognized when the charity has been notified in writing of both the amount and settlement date.

Rental income is recognized in the period to which it relates.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its estimated useful life.

Freehold property

- Straight line over 50 years

Fixtures and fittings

- 15% reducing balance & 5% straight line

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
