Principal activity

Notes to the financial statements

1 Accounting Policies

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the FRS 102 Section 1A Small Entities. The company has elected to adopt the provisions of FRS 102 amendments relating to the taxation of charitable donations.

The preparation of financial statements in compliance with FRS 102 Section 1A Small Entities requires the use of certain critical accounting estimates. It also requires management to exercise judgement in applying the accounting policies.

The following principal accounting policies have been applied:

Turnover

Turnover represents total charges for goods and services sold net of taxes. Contracted service income is recognised when the service has been.

Debtors

Trade and other debtors are recognised at the settlement amount due after any trade discount offered. Prepayments are valued at the amount prepaid net of any trade discounts due.

Cash at bank and in hand

Cash at bank and cash in hand includes cash and short term highly liquid investments with a short maturity of three months or less from the date of acquisition or opening of the deposit or similar account.

Qualifying charitable donations

Charitable donations made to the Company's parent entity are treated as a distribution and recognised when the donation is declared and paid.

Creditors and provisions

Creditors and provisions are recognised where the charity has a present obligation resulting from a past event that will probably result in the transfer of funds to a third party and the amount due to settle the obligation can be measured or estimated reliably. Creditors and provisions are normally recognised at their settlement amount after allowing for any trade discounts due.

Taxation

Corporation tax is charged to the income statement in the same period in which a profit occurs and takes into account taxation deferred because of timing differences between the treatment of certain items for taxation and accounting purposes.

The taxation effect of a charitable donation to a wholly owned parent undertaking will be recognised in the period which it affects if it is probable that such a donation will be made within the required period under tax legislation.

Turnover cost of sales and expenses are stated net of any applicable Value Added Tax.

Going concern

Based on company's cash flow projections for the period ending twelve months from the date of approval of these financial statements, the Directors consider that the company will continue to operate and meet all of its committed expenditure and debt as they fall due. On this basis the Directors consider it appropriate to prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis.

Cash flow statement

The accounts do not include a cash flow statement because the company, a small reporting entity, is exempt from the requirements to prepare such a statement.
