The directors present their report and the audited financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 December 2007

Principal activities

The principal activity of the company is inspection and testing services, specifically preshipment inspection of manufactured and consumer goods for export

Review of business and future developments

The directors consider both the year-end position and the result for the year to be satisfactory

It is not anticipated that the business will trade in the foreseeable future

Principal risks and uncertainties

Given that the company's operations are being wound down the directors do not consider there to be specific risks and uncertainties affecting the company. The company is dependent on the operations of fellow group companies to support the recoverability of the various intergroup balances.

The group maintains insurance for the directors in respect of their duties as directors of the group

Financial risk management

Financial risk management, including the use of financial instruments and the related currency, liquidity, credit and interest rate risks, is dealt with by the central functions of the Inspicio Limited group on behalf of the company Many of the company's balances are with other members of the Inspicio group, and assessments are made by management as to the recoverability of these balances in the overall context of the group

Directors' responsibilities

Company law requires the directors to prepare financial statements for each financial year that give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the company and of the profit or loss of the company for that period. The directors are required to prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis, unless it is inappropriate to presume that the company will continue in business.

The directors confirm that suitable accounting policies have been used and applied consistently and reasonable and prudent judgements and estimates have been made in the preparation of the financial statements for the year ended 31 December 2007. The directors also confirm that applicable accounting standards have been followed and that the financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis.

1 Principal accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with applicable Accounting Standards in the United Kingdom A summary of the more important accounting policies, which have been applied consistently, is set out below

In accordance with Financial Reporting Standard ("FRS") 18, "Accounting Policies", the directors confirm that the accounting policies used by the company are the most appropriate, consistently applied and adequately disclosed

Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared in accordance with the historical cost convention.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption available to it under Financial Reporting Standard 1, which provides that where a company is a member of a group and the ultimate parent company produces financial statements that are publicly available, the company does not have to prepare a cash flow statement

Related party transactions

The company has taken advantage of the exemption available under Financial Reporting Standard 8 ("Related Party Transactions") not to provide details of transactions with other group companies

Foreign currencies

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded using the rate of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated using the rate of exchange ruling at the balance sheet date and the gains or losses on translation are included in the profit and loss account

Deferred taxation

Provision is made for deferred taxation, using the liability method, on all material timing differences to the extent that it is probable that a liability or asset will crystallise

Operating leases

Costs in respect of operating leases are charged on a straight line basis over the lease term

1 Principal accounting policies (continued)

Tangible fixed assets

The cost of tangible fixed assets is their purchase cost, together with any incidental costs of acquisition. The company does not capitalise finance costs

Depreciation is calculated so as to write off the cost of tangible fixed assets, less their estimated residual values, on a straight line basis over the expected useful economic lives of the assets concerned. The principal annual rates used for this purpose are

12 Financial commitments

At 31 December 2007 and 31 December 2006, the company had no annual commitments under non-cancellable operating leases

Along with other group undertakings, the company has guaranteed certain loans of Inspicio Holdings Limited, which at 31 December 2007 amounted to £58,700,000 (2006 £48,372,000). The loans are secured by fixed and floating charges over the assets of the company. The Directors believe that there will be no material impact on the company's financial position as a result of these guarantees.

13 Contingent liabilities and post balance sheet events

At 31 December 2007, the company was contesting the decision of a government agency in respect of the rate of sales tax on certain overseas sales made by the company Since the balance sheet date, the court case relating to sales tax has been determined. The decision went against the company and therefore all of the disputed sales tax became payable. This tax was settled by the company and shortly thereafter reimbursed by the previous owner, under the terms of an indemnity put in place at the time of the sale.

14 Immediate and ultimate parent undertaking

The company is a wholly-owned subsidiary of Daniel C Griffith Holdings Limited, a company registered in England and Wales

The largest and smallest group in which the results of the company are consolidated is that headed by Inspicio Limited The consolidated accounts of this group are available to the public and may be obtained from 10 Buckingham Street, London, WC2N 6DF

In February 2008, the Inspicio Limited group was acquired by Inspicio Sarl, a company incorporated in Luxembourg. The directors consider Inspicio Sarl to be the ultimate controlling party.
